PUBLIC HEARINGS

PRESENTATIONS

Representative Jeff Dotseth was present to give a brief overview of his priorities for the upcoming legislative session. Dotseth's priorities include addressing housing and broadband in greater Minnesota, government fraud, reducing unpaid mandates and giving more control to local governments, supporting infrastructure, and bringing additional funding to the region through growth of the community and tax base.

Councilor Lamb's concerns and priorities for the upcoming legislation session include finding ways for Seniors to stay in their homes, support for the Cloquet Area Fire District, low income and Senior financial support for housing repairs, and addressing cyber harassment.

Mayor Maki commented he hopes the legislative session will not fall into a gridlock situation with the make up being almost split between Republican and Democrats.

Councilor Kolodge stated he would like to see more funding help with city streets and infrastructure.

Councilor Jaakola's priorities include funding for state mandates, financial assistance for families caring for aging family members, housing for aging, environmental stewardship, and healthcare.

APPROVING LRIP GRANT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

MOTION:

Councilor Kolodge moved and Councilor Jaakola seconded the motion to adopt RESOLUTION NO. 25-03, A RESOLUTION APPROVING LOCAL ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM GRANT TERMS AND CONDITIONS SAP 112-129-001. The motion carried unanimously (5-0).

WHEREAS, The City of Cloquet has applied to the Commissioner of Transportation for a grant from the Local Road Improvement Fund; and

WHEREAS, The Commissioner of Transportation has given notice that funding for this project is available; and

WHEREAS, The amount of the grant has been determined to be \$ 1,383,906.86 by reason of the lowest responsible bid;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA, does hereby agree to the terms and conditions of the grant consistent with Minnesota Statutes, section 174.52, and will pay any additional

amount by which the cost exceeds the estimate, and will return to the Local Road Improvement Fund any amount appropriated for the project but not required. Caleb Peterson, Public Works Director, is authorized to execute a grant agreement and any amendments thereto with the Commissioner of Transportation concerning the abovereferenced grant.

AWARDING 2025 RECONSTRUCTION OF ARMORY ROAD

MOTION:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA, That all bids for Potable Water Test Wells received as part of the December 19, 2024, solicitation are hereby rejected;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Engineer is directed to coordinate with the consultant engineer and perspective bidders to determine if rebidding of the project is feasible at this time.

AUTHORIZE ZAMBONI PURCHASE

MOTION:

Councilor Keller moved and Councilor Kolodge seconded the motion to approve the purchase of a 1993 Zamboni from Hudson Ice Arena for the total amount of \$28,000. The motion passed unanimously (5-0).

Proposed Action

The Planning Commission recommends the City Council move to adopt RESOLUTION NO. 25-09, A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE VACATION OF ANTHONY AVENUE LYING EAST OF PINEWOOD DRIVE AND SOUTH OF 1410 WEST PROSPECT AVENUE.

Background/Overview

Ryan & Zach, LLC, is proposing to vacate Anthony Avenue lying east of Pinewood Drive and south of 1410 West Prospect Avenue. This is being requested since Anthony Avenue was platted with the Lagenbrunner in 1964 and has never been constructed. There are no utilities within this right-of-way.

A legal notice was published in the Pine Knot on November 22, 2024 and effected property owners were sent notices of the public hearing. The December 10, 2024 regular meeting was cancelled due to a lack of a quroum and the public hearing continued to the January 14, 2025 Planning Commission meeting.

Policy Objectives

The purpose of this Vacation application is to ensure that MN State Statute 160.29 and 412.851 are followed in giving up rights to property. There is no formal requirement for determining if a street should be vacated. The platted street is not improved and there are no city utilities within the right of way. It is really up to a commonsense approach as to whether there is currently or will be in the future a need for the street that is being vacated.

Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

The filing fee for the vacation of a street is \$350.00. The applicant has paid that fee.

Advisory Committee/Commission Action

The Planning Commission, after hearing from nobody except the applicant, discussed the request further. The Planning Commission has recommended approval of the Vacation on a 3-0 vote.



Authorization for Appointment of a Police Officer

Proposed Action

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the probationary appointment of Marcus Childs to the position of Police Officer.

Background/Overview

The 2025 budget includes approved funding for 24 sworn police officers who provide services to the cities of Cloquet, Scanlon, and a portion of the Fond du Lac Indian Reservation. These staffing levels are consistent with the 2014 Law Enforcement Analysis of the Cloquet Police Department by the Upper Midwest Community Policing Institute, in conjunction with the Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association's identified best practices and optimum staffing levels to provide and manage police services. The latest Novak Consulting firm's 2019 assessment of the Police Department also supports this staffing number.

Currently, the active department staff consists of 19 sworn officers out of the established 24. We have two commanders, four patrol sergeants, two full-time detectives, one School Resource Officer, and nine patrol officers.

The shortage of sworn personnel can create challenges in the department regarding appropriate staffing levels, budgetary issues related to shift-replacement over time, and the availability of staff to keep up with administrative duties.

In late 2024, we began the hiring process. The process included a pre-screening questionnaire and an oral interview with our panel, which included our Citizen's Advisory Board. After those steps, the background investigation, physical exam, psychological exam, and fitness test process were conducted on the top candidates.

Mr. Childs has completed the required medical and psychological assessment and is recommended for employment.

After hiring, all new officers must complete three months of field training and have a one-year probationary period.

Candidate Background/Bio

Marcus Childs is from Duluth, Minnesota. After high school, he attended Fond du Lac Tribal and Community College for Law Enforcement. He has been a police officer for the Fond du Lac Reservation Police Department for a little over two years. Marcus said working as an officer has been a lifelong goal, and he enjoys it immensely.

When he's not on duty, Marcus enjoys fishing, spending time with his dog, and being a passionate hockey fan.

After purchasing his first home in Cloquet, he is eager to work and expand his life in the city. In the future, Marcus aspires to build upon his peace officer career with the Cloquet Police Department.

Police Objectives

The hiring of this position is consistent with the City Council's previous actions. Maintaining adequate staffing levels will allow the Police Department to continue providing excellent service to our community.

Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

The City has no other financial implications, as the positions are included in the 2025 budget.

Advisory Committee/Commission Action

The Police Citizen Advisory Board assisted the administration with creating the current eligibility list.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee frequently works near moving mechanical parts and in outside weather conditions. The employee may occasionally be exposed to blood and airborne pathogens.

The noise level in the work environment is usually moderate.

As part of the City's 5-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) and approved budget, the concrete curb and gutter, bituminous pavement, water storm and sanitary sewer utilities in 8th Street from Sahlman Avenue to Prospect Avenue were reconstructed in 2024.

A Public Hearing on the proposed project was held on March 6, 2024. Following the hearing, the City Council ordered the improvement. Bids for the project were awarded and construction was substantially completed in the fall of 2024.

A proposed final assessment role for the improvement is in the process of being prepared and in accordance with MN Statutes Chapter 429 the City Council is required to schedule and give notice of a Public Hearing on the Proposed Assessment, at which time property owners affected by the improvement will be given an opportunity to express concerns with reference to the final assessment. Proposed Action

The Planning Commission recommends the City Council move to adopt **ORDINANCE NO. 515A, AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 17, BY AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET FROM "FR – FARM RESIDENTIAL" TO "RC – REGIONAL COMMERCIAL".**

Background/Overview

CMK Properties, LLC is proposing a rezoning for the property located at 1604 Highway 33 South from FR – Farm Residnetial to RC – Regional Commercial. CMK Properties, LLC is proposing this change for potential commercial development of the property.

Land Use Plan and Rezoning

In August 2007 the City Council adopted the 2007 - 2027 Comprehensive Plan for the City of Cloquet. Chapter 3 of the Plan, Land Use, discusses Inventory and Analysis; Goals, Objectives, and Policies; and, Land Use Plan. As part of that adoption the property was guided on the Land Use Plan as Highway Commercial. The property is approximately 8 acres in size and is currently zoned Farm Residential. The properties to the north and west are zoned Regional Commercial, to the east Office and Manufacturing, and to the south Farm Residential. The property is served by municipal utilities with access to Highway 33 via a city owned frontage road.

Staff has reviewed the language in the Comprehensive Plan pertaining to "Highway Commercial". The Highway Commercial guided properties were setup to improve the existing highway commercial uses in this area which includes a large discount department store, a grocery store/shopping center, a variety of restaurants and retail shops, motels, a car dealership, and a movie theater. The rezoning is consistent with the land use plan, with adjacent land use in the area, and is served by the appropriate infrastructure to support commercial development. The RC – Regional Commercial is appropriate for the area.

Policy Objectives

The Land Use Plan portion of the Comprehensive Plan discusses the "Highway Commercial". An excerpt of the land use category for "Highway Commercial" is attached. The Comprehensive Plan guides two primary areas for highway commercial use along State Highway 33 north and south of the St. Louis River. The plan does not have any specific locational criteria for where certain districts should be located. The Rezoning of the property is to be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

The rezoning will require approval by the City Council as an Ordinance and requires two readings of the ordinance at a council meeting.

Financial Impacts

The Rezoning fee was paid.

Advisory Committee/Commission Action

A legal notice was published in the Pine Knot on January 3, 2025 and property owners within 350 feet were sent notices of the public hearing. A public hearing was held on Tuesday, January 14, 2025 to consider the rezoning. The Planning Commission has recommended approval of the Rezoning on a 3 - 0 vote.


