Para asegurar la imparcialidad y el orden durante las asambleas, el Ayuntamiento ha adoptado ciertas reglas de cortesía que aplican a todos los miembros del Ayuntamiento, al personal administrativo, personal de los medios de comunicación, a los ciudadanos, y a visitantes. Estos reglamentos establecen lo siguiente:

- That no one shall delay or interrupt the proceedings, or refuse to obey the orders of the presiding officer.
- All persons should refrain from private conversation, eating, drinking and smoking while in the Council Chamber.
- Posters or placards must remain outside the Council Chamber.
- No cellular phones or audible beepers allowed in Council Chamber while City Council is in session.

“Citizens and other visitors attending City Council meetings shall observe the same rules of propriety, decorum and good conduct applicable to members of the City Council. Any person making personal, impertinent, profane or slanderous remarks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the City Council or while attending the City Council meeting shall be removed from the room if the sergeant-at-arms is so directed by the presiding officer, and the person shall be barred from further audience before the City Council during that session of the City Council. If the presiding officer fails to act, any member of the City Council may move to require enforcement of the rules, and the affirmative vote of a majority of the City Council shall require the presiding officer to act.” Section 3.3(c) of the City Council Rules of Procedure. para hacer cumplir las reglas establecidas, y el voto afirmativo de la mayoría del Ayuntamiento Municipal precisara al oficial que este presidiendo la sesión a tomar acción.” Según la sección 3.3 (c) de las reglas de procedimientos del Ayuntamiento.

The OCPO's primary function is to monitor DPD investigations of external administrative complaints or critical incidents, oversee mediations, independently investigate administrative investigations upon the conclusion of an internal affairs investigation (case disposition and discipline); review findings of internal affairs investigations or investigations of critical incidents and report the findings to the board; provide support services to the board such as aiding the board and the technical resource panel in their work; and assist the board with preparing reports. The OCPO does not represent complainants or assist in any monetary recovery or other damages sought by a complainant.

I. Call to Order & Roll Call **(Chairman John Mark Davidson)**

II. Purpose of Meeting **(Chairman John Mark Davidson)**

a. During the May 13, 2025, meeting, the board decided to send a letter to Dallas Police Chief Comeaux requesting his stance on immigration and the Dallas Police Department's involvement in the deportations taking place by ICE. The chief's response lacked elements critical to understanding his stance, so a second letter has been prepared in response. This meeting is to discuss the elements of this letter.

III. Public Comments/Open Microphone **(3 minutes per person)**

Chairman Davidson invites the public to provide comments, both in person and online. However, no community members were present to share any comments.

Action item

IV. Discussion on the Role of DPD in Immigration Enforcement **(Chairman John Mark Davidson)**

a. Submittal of a letter to Chief Comeaux

Meeting Purpose:

The meeting was convened to discuss and vote on a revised draft letter addressed to Chief Eddie Comeaux of the Dallas Police Department. The letter responds to a prior communication from Chief Comeaux, which the board deemed incomplete regarding his stance on immigration enforcement and DPD's involvement with ICE.

Chairman John Mark Davidson Opening Remarks:

The Chair outlined the purpose of the meeting and emphasized the importance of submitting the letter by Monday morning to provide Chief Comeaux ample time to review it ahead of the board's scheduled meeting on Tuesday at 5:30 PM.

The Chair explained that the Policy Committee was originally tasked with reviewing the letter but had been unable to meet in time. To proceed efficiently, the board was asked to consider a motion to discharge the committee of its responsibility for this item, allowing the full board to debate and vote on the draft directly.

The Chair noted that any board member may choose whether to attach their name to the final letter. Although the Chair holds the authority to send the letter independently, he stated that he would abide by the board's decision in the spirit of collective governance.

Motion to Discharge Policy Committee:

- Motion by: Mr. Timothy Jackson (District 7)
- Seconded by: Dr. Lauren Gilbert Smith (District 4)
- Vote Outcome: Motion passed unanimously.

Motion to Approve Draft Letter:

- Motion by: Judge C. Victor Lander (District 8)
- Seconded by: Mr. Walter "Changa" Higgins (District 3)
- Open for discussion

Discussion Format:

The Chair opened the floor for discussion, allowing each board member up to five minutes to comment. The discussion order was left open (not by district), and participants were asked to be respectful of time. Board members attending virtually were also encouraged to keep their cameras on per city protocol.

Mr. Brandon Friedman (District 14):

Expressed support for the current draft and noted he would vote in favor regardless of whether his suggestions were incorporated. However, he proposed that the letter should include clear expectations for Chief Comeaux regarding DPD's collaboration with ICE. He read a list of criteria that, if violated by state or federal agencies, should prompt DPD to cease cooperation. These included the use of escalatory force, warrantless searches, concealed identities, removal of name tags during operations, arrests without cause, and intimidation of officials or residents. He offered to email the proposed language to the Chair or Director for consideration. Which included the following points:

- Attempts by state and federal law enforcement agencies to use escalatory force that runs contrary to the DPD code of conduct.
- Searching or seizing individuals without judicial warrants.
- Detaining or arresting individuals without first properly identifying themselves or while concealing their faces.
- Requiring DPD officers to remove their name tags during joint operations.
- Detaining or arresting individuals for non-criminal acts protected by the U.S. Constitution.
- Forcibly deporting detainees in violation of court orders.
- Threatening or intimidating local officials in the process of carrying out their duties.
- Threatening or intimidating Dallas residents for exercising their legally protected rights.

Dr. Lauren Gilbert-Smith (District 4):

Agreed with Mr. Friedman's concerns, particularly with ICE entering private property unlawfully and targeting peaceful demonstrators. Supported including his proposed criteria in the letter and suggested a follow-up letter might also be necessary to address

these broader issues. Dr. Gilbert-Smith requested that Mr. Friedman's list be shared with all members, including those attending remotely, and offered to help with email distribution.

Chairman's Note:

Acknowledged the presence of **Mr. David Kitner (District 13)** and **Vice Chair Ozzie Smith (District 1)** for the record.

Ms. Deatra Wadsworth (District 12):

Agreed that the letter should include specific expectations for Chief Comeaux. Emphasized the need for legal clarity and suggested the Chief consult with the City Attorney to ensure all collaboration aligns with existing rules and legal standards. Wadsworth referenced a recent article about "Operation Justice Trail," which mentioned that the operation appeared to be conducted in compliance with departmental procedures, though it involved some individuals with ICE holds. She also expressed concerns about prior comments made by the Chief and recommended that he also seek clarification from the City Manager.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Opened the floor for questions

Mr. Tim Jackson (District 7):

Commented on the recent news report of 98 arrests under Operation Justice Trail, noting that only three individuals had ICE holds. Expressed concern about potential contradictions in the board's approach: accepting warrant-based arrests for citizens without issue, yet raising concerns when enforcement actions involve undocumented individuals. Argued that all those arrested were previously convicted and not "random people being rounded up." Stated his belief that the Chief does not owe the board a direct explanation, but recommended that the Chief obtain an opinion from the City Attorney regarding legal compliance and communicate the findings back to the board.

Mr. Walter Higgins (District 3):

Higgins spoke in support of Board Member Friedman's proposed additions to the letter. He challenged Mr. Jackson's stance, emphasizing that the Chief is accountable to the board, especially when trust between law enforcement and marginalized communities is at stake. He highlighted the board's oversight role and the importance of asking questions on behalf of concerned communities. He asserted that demanding transparency is essential for building public trust and fostering effective policing.

Mr. Jackson (Response):

Stated he respectfully disagreed with Mr. Higgins. Voiced concern about emotional or reactionary responses from the board being perceived as lacking impact or credibility. Argued for setting a thoughtful, consistent precedent that invites constructive dialogue with the new Chief. Reiterated the need for inclusive discussion that values diverse viewpoints.

Mr. Walter Higgins (District 3):

Reinforced that the board's role is to ask tough questions and address serious issues, especially those affecting historically marginalized communities. Rejected the notion that raising racial concerns is "knee-jerk," referencing the board's formation as a direct result of advocacy by Black and Latino leaders seeking accountability. Urged his fellow board members to deepen their understanding of oversight and modern policing frameworks.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Thanked Mr. Higgins and acknowledged the participation of board members from Districts 3, 4, 7, 9, 12, and 14. Invited further comments.

Ms. Alison Griner-Allen (District 9):

Outlined three key concerns for inclusion in the letter:

- **Illegal Conduct by Federal Partners:** Called for DPD officers to intervene, report, and prevent illegal activity during joint operations with federal agencies, including ICE, especially in cases involving masked or unidentified agents.
- **Protester Surveillance and Data Sharing:** Opposed the use of facial recognition or drone footage from protests being shared with federal agencies. Advocated for the protection of First Amendment rights and clear limitations on surveillance.
- **Public Trust and Immigration Status:** Recommended adopting a policy of not asking individuals about immigration status during investigations of local crimes. Supported increased use of **cite-and-release** to avoid triggering ICE notifications via fingerprinting. Suggested virtual options (e.g., Zoom) for individuals hesitant to report crimes in person due to immigration fears.

Praised Chief Comeaux's stated intent to avoid immigration enforcement duties but encouraged clearer, tangible policies to reassure residents. Stressed the importance of building a police culture rooted in trust, safety, and constitutional compliance.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Thanked Ms. Griner-Allen for her comprehensive contribution. Indicated a summary of all proposed additions and recommendations would be prepared for consideration before the vote on the letter.

Mr. Pegram (District 6):

Reiterated that the priorities outlined in the letter—safety, well-being, and peace of mind—should reflect the board's commitment to ensuring residents do not live in fear. Emphasized that these are not just policy preferences but essential needs for a functioning and equitable city. Expressed support for incorporating the ideas raised by Board Members Griner-Allen and Friedman into the final version of the letter.

Judge Lander (District 8):

Voiced strong support for legal clarity in law enforcement procedures. Stressed the need for judicial warrants over administrative ones and criticized the lack of transparency around such practices. Raised concern over masked or unidentified officers operating in public spaces, particularly in an open-carry state like Texas, where identification is critical for public safety. Supported edits that establish clear expectations for the Chief and reiterated the importance of specifying what actions the board expects DPD to take.

Mr. Pegram (District 6) [Follow-up]:

Clarified that these expectations are not just requests, but operational necessities. Agreed with Judge Lander's assertion that the board should insist on them, not merely suggest.

Mr. David Kitner (District 13):

Expressed hesitation about the current process for drafting the letter, warning that piecemeal additions may reduce its clarity and effectiveness. Emphasized that letters written by committees often lack coherence. As a practicing attorney, he underscored the need for adherence to due process and expressed concern over deportation tactics, such as those involving removals to El Salvador, that may violate those rights. Stated opposition to sending the letter in its current form, citing a lack of concrete information and clarity on the Chief's actual policy stance. Recommended that the board collect questions for the Chief and wait for his formal response before drafting any correspondence.

Ms. King (District 10):

Agreed with Mr. Kitner, emphasizing that proceeding with the letter might be premature. Voiced concern about drawing negative attention to the City of Dallas by preemptively issuing a public stance without complete context. Supported the idea of submitting specific questions to Chief Comeaux ahead of the upcoming meeting. Also, earlier points about ensuring that the police department complies with laws and internal policy were echoed,

and it was affirmed that DPD's current culture has not shown signs of indiscriminate enforcement.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Acknowledged the range of perspectives expressed. Noted that comments have now been received from Districts 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13, and 14. This indicated that all points would be recorded and synthesized for board review —stated intention to revisit the letter discussion following the board's meeting with Chief Comeaux.

Mr. Friedman (District 14):

Requested to respond to earlier comments and clarified that the Chief had already received a question from the board weeks prior and responded with only a terse, six-to-ten-word reply. Stated that the current letter should not be seen as premature but rather as a timely follow-up requesting elaboration. Acknowledged Mr. Kitner's concern about letters written by the committee, but emphasized the necessity of the communication, given the Chief's prior minimal response.

Ms. Jennifer King (District 10):

Ms. Jennifer King noted she had not seen the Chief's original response and expressed understanding of Mr. Friedman's position. Proposed a more diplomatic tone, emphasizing a desire to open a constructive dialogue with the Chief rather than making demands. Stated that, at present, there is no clear issue or violation requiring immediate correction and that specifics can be addressed as they arise.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Recapped that input has now been received from Districts 3, 4, 6, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13, and 14. Invited comments from Districts 1 and 11.

Ms. Arlene Steinfield (District 11):

Voiced strong support for sending the letter promptly. Highlighted concerns about a deteriorating national commitment to the rule of law, particularly in immigration matters. Advocated for including language in the letter emphasizing the Chief's obligation to uphold the rule of law. Stated that the Chief's brief prior response was insufficient and that the current draft provides an appropriate vehicle for requesting more clarity.

Mr. David Kitner (District 13) [Follow-up]:

Agreed that the Chief's earlier response was minimal, but reiterated his discomfort with moving forward on the letter without more information. Emphasized the importance of understanding what "following the law" actually means in the operational context. Reiterated the need for more detailed engagement before formalizing the board's stance in writing.

Ms. Steinfield (District 11) [Follow-up]:

Agreed to disagree with Mr. Kitner. The letter already seeks further information and can be supplemented later, but that a response from the Chief is due now.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Thanked Ms. Steinfield and recognized Vice Chair Ozzie Smith.

Vice Chair Ozzie Smith (District 1):

Stated he would vote *no* on sending the letter at this time. Explained that the timing of the letter is the core concern. Emphasized the opportunity for real-time engagement and follow-up when the board meets with the Chief next week—an opportunity not afforded by written correspondence.

Warned that sending a letter now could delay getting meaningful answers, as the Chief's office would likely take time to respond in writing, making it redundant with the upcoming meeting.

Encouraged the board to use the upcoming meeting for direct questioning, noting that a letter may still be appropriate afterward, particularly if responses from the Chief are insufficient or unsatisfactory.

Closed by affirming that the board is already compiling questions for the Chief and that a more informed letter could be crafted based on that exchange.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Thanked Vice Chair Smith for the thoughtful input. Acknowledged the complexity and range of views on the issue. Confirmed that comments have now been received from all districts.

Thanked Vice Chair Smith for his remarks. Confirmed comments have been received from Districts 1, 3, 4, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14. Invited remaining members to use their time.

Jonathan Maples (District 2):

Expressed appreciation for the letter and acknowledged the need to address the Chief's prior brief response. Highlighted growing public fear and erosion of trust in law

enforcement, as seen firsthand through his monthly food drives, which have seen a 40% decrease in participation due to community fear.

Stressed the importance of asking questions and reaffirmed that his role on the board is rooted in accountability to the public, not fear or formality. Urged fellow members to give the Chief due process, especially with a scheduled meeting coming up on Tuesday.

Recommended waiting to send the letter until after that meeting and using the six-week gap before the August session to gather information, including the Chief's responses, data, and community concerns. Asserted the board should clarify its expectations to the Chief, just as community members would if asked.

Concluded by raising concerns over Senate Bill 8 (SB 8), stating that it may affect the board's authority or capacity to act, and requested that Ms. Siara provide clarity. Emphasized the importance of not wasting time and expressed hope for a productive Tuesday meeting.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Thanked Mr. Maples for his thoughtful comments.

Tim Jackson (District 7):

Opened by affirming the board's authority as an oversight body, tasked with creating accountability for the police department and responding to community concerns.

Voiced concern that the current letter was overly curated by city staff and lacked clarity due to political caution, making it an inadequate unified statement from the board. Stressed the need for alignment and internal agreement before submitting anything on behalf of the board.

Echoed previous concerns about Senate Bill 8 and how its implementation may limit the board's long-term ability to act, questioning whether reactive actions now may become ineffective later.

Criticized the Chief's earlier statement for lacking detail and noted that, although the Chief claimed the department will not search for immigrants or engage in any special programs, such generalities warrant further scrutiny. Urged the board to avoid emotionally driven appeals and instead take a strategic, measured approach.

Suggested that any genuine engagement with the Chief should occur in person, stating that body language, tone, and dialogue would be more telling than written responses. Warned against issuing a blanket letter at a time when the board lacks consensus.

Encouraged the board to wait until after the upcoming meeting with the Chief before deciding whether or not to proceed with the letter. Reiterated the need for thoughtful compromise, strategy, and recognition of external constraints such as SB 8. Called for an approach grounded in analysis and long-term thinking rather than assumptions or emotional reactions.

Yielded the remainder of his time to any other board members.

Mr. Friedman (District 14) [Follow Up]:

Requested to respond and was granted the floor by the Chairman. Emphasized that the board's actions have not been reckless but rather carefully deliberated. Acknowledged that composing a letter by committee is inherently challenging, but expressed concern that delaying a decision could cause the board to lose momentum.

Proposed the following course of action:

- Vote tonight on whether to send the draft letter as written by Monday.
- Proceed with the scheduled meeting with the Chief on Tuesday.
- If necessary, follow up after that meeting with an additional, more detailed letter outlining the board's expectations and concerns.

Warned that failing to reach consensus on sending the letter before the meeting risks the letter never being sent at all.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Affirmed Mr. Friedman's suggestion as a good one and invited any strong thoughts from board members. Announced that Mr. Brian Bah (District 5) would speak next, but first allowed Dr. Loren Gilbert-Smith (District 4) a final brief response. Reminded speakers to keep comments under one minute and that there would be a final round of responses later.

Dr. Loren Gilbert-Smith (District 4):

Commented on the rarity of direct engagement with the Police Chief, noting that former Chief Garcia only attended board meetings twice and that several meetings between the Chair and Chief had been canceled. Asserted that the board was not being impulsive, as this was the third time the matter had been discussed. Spoke personally, referencing her background in an immigrant family and expressing deep concern over the national rhetoric on citizenship revocation, illustrating the fear felt in affected communities. Concluded by affirming the need to take meaningful action now.

Tim Jackson (District 7):

Responded respectfully to Dr. Gilbert-Smith, clarifying that he did not intend to dismiss or minimize her experience.

Expressed concern that the discussion was becoming circular and reiterated his belief that the board should hear directly from the Chief as planned.

Mr. Jackson acknowledged that the Chief may not attend every meeting, but emphasized that the opportunity on Tuesday should be honored. Concluded by stating, "We can agree to disagree."

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Thanked Mr. Jackson and invited Mr. Brian Bah (District 5) to speak.

Brian Bah (District 5):

Agreed with Mr. Friedman's earlier remarks, stating that sending the current version of the letter does not preclude the board from sending a more detailed or revised version later.

Mr. Bah believed the letter was thoughtfully written and serves as a strong foundation for the upcoming conversation with the Chief. Suggested that board members who do not support the current letter should refrain from signing it, allowing others to move forward without forcing a consensus.

Jonathan Maples (District 2):

Requested to briefly respond to Mr. Bah's comment. Suggested breaking the letter into bullet points to facilitate asking the Chief clear and direct questions during the upcoming Tuesday meeting. Proposed drafting a more complete letter after that interaction.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Took the floor for his five-minute comment period.

- Expressed appreciation for the board's active engagement and the quality of discussion.
- Affirmed his support for sending the current version of the letter, characterizing it as a respectful and necessary request for clarification.
- Provided context: an initial inquiry was sent to the Chief with questions composed by Brandon Friedman, to which the Chief replied simply with "Obey the law."
- Framed the board's letter as a thoughtful follow-up seeking explanation, not as an accusation or criticism.
- Emphasized that the letter serves as a foundation to start deeper conversations, with Tuesday's meeting providing an opportunity for verbal engagement and a potential future letter based on the Chief's responses.
- Reiterated that waiting could delay or derail action and that sending the letter now allows progress.
- Called for a one-minute round of final comments from each board member before proceeding to a vote.

Jennifer King (District 10):

- Questioned the distinction between sending the letter now and raising the same points during Tuesday's meeting.
- Expressed preference for a more strategic approach by holding off on the letter until after the meeting.
- Acknowledged frustration with the Chief's vague response but advocated for polite, direct discussion in person before formalizing further communication.
- Suggested the board could revisit the letter afterward if needed.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Acknowledged Ms. King's comments and turned to Mr. Pegram (District 6).

Mr. Pegram (District 6):

- Referenced a prior point made by Mr. Kitner (District 13) about moving forward based on anticipation.
- Emphasized that anticipation should be grounded in hope for a positive outcome.
- Indicated support for advancing with the letter to encourage constructive dialogue.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Opened the floor to other follow-up comments.

Ms. Wadsworth (District 12):

- Affirmed support for the letter, stating it was carefully crafted and diplomatically phrased.
- Highlighted the lack of specificity in the Chief's initial response as a primary concern.
- Cited uncertainty over the Chief's attendance on Tuesday and the board's upcoming July recess as reasons to act now.
- Confirmed intent to vote in favor and sign the letter, while looking forward to receiving further responses at the upcoming meeting.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Acknowledged Ms. Wadsworth's comments and turned to Judge Victor Lander (District 8).

Judge Victor Lander (District 8):

- Initially wanted modifications to the draft letter.
- After hearing the discussion, expressed support for sending the letter as is.
- Described the Chief's response as flippant and inadequate.
- Will vote in favor and sign the letter.

Brandon Friedman (District 14):

- Agreed with others that the Chief may not attend Tuesday's meeting, citing historical trends.
- Emphasized the need to act now, given the lack of a July meeting and general time constraints.
- Expressed concern about waiting for a crisis to respond, referencing challenges faced by other cities.
- Supports sending the letter immediately.

Jonathan Maples (District 2):

- Supports sending a letter, but emphasized caution in how the board proceeds with any follow-up.
- Highlighted the hope that the new Chief might set a new precedent by showing up.
- Warned about legal implications and the possibility of the city being exposed to legal risks.
- Recommended to involve legal counsel if needed when drafting any follow-up communications.

Walter Higgins (District 3):

- Acknowledged value in being strategic.
- Supports sending the letter proactively, describing it as a valid tool for both communication and accountability.
- Expressed openness to adding to the letter later or raising more detailed questions at Tuesday's meeting.
- Urged the board to pursue both written and verbal engagement approaches simultaneously.

Alison Grinter-Allen (District 9):

- Clarified legally that SB8 does not impact the Dallas Police Department, only the Sheriff's Office.
- Emphasized that the Police Chief should be able to handle respectful scrutiny.
- Framed the letter as polite but necessary pressure and a matter of public record.
- Supports sending the letter now and preparing additional follow-up questions for the Tuesday meeting.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

- Confirmed that a second round of comments had been heard from Districts 3, 8, 9, 10, 12, and 14.
- Invited any other districts to speak.

David Kitner (District 13):

- Emphasized the letter's timing spans only a few days, and the Chief's presence should be assumed until proven otherwise.
- Expressed concern that the tone and structure of the current letter may be broader than the Chair's verbal framing as "a simple question."
- Noted that the letter contains multiple embedded points and implications, not just one overarching inquiry.
- Remains observant of how the letter's content aligns with its intended purpose.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

Acknowledges and thanks Mr. Kitner for his comments

Mr. Jackson (District 7):

- Expressed frustration with dismissive attitudes and emphasized that labeling it "just a letter" minimizes valid board concerns.
- Urged professional respect for differing opinions during board deliberations.
- Proposed including a statement in the letter acknowledging board members who may not support the letter.
- Indicated willingness to sign such a statement and expressed skepticism about assumptions surrounding the Chief's attendance.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

- Acknowledged Mr. Jackson's comments and thanked him for his input.
- Noted that members from Districts 3, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13, and 14 had provided remarks.
- Recognized additional raised hands but respectfully recommended concluding the discussion.
- Suggested it was time to proceed to a vote given the board's readiness.

Motion to Vote:

- The Chairman called the question to move to a formal vote on whether to send the draft letter to Chief Comeaux as written.
- Clarified voting procedure: Board members to respond "yay" if in favor of sending the letter as is, and "nay" if opposed.
- Explained that inclusion of individual board member names on the letter would be voluntary, based on personal discretion.

A roll call vote was initiated:

The Motion passes to send transmit a letter of request for clarification on DPD's collaboration with Federal immigration to Dallas Police Chief Comeaux.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

- Confirmed that the board will send the letter to the Police Chief requesting further clarification on his stance regarding immigration enforcement.

- Noted that the Office of Community Police Oversight will facilitate sending the letter.
- Board members have the option to add their names to the letter but are under no obligation to do so.
- Opened the floor for any final comments.

Jennifer King (District 10):

- Suggested adding a statement in the letter expressing that the board looks forward to the Chief's elaboration on these issues at the upcoming Tuesday meeting.
- Recommended reinforcing the expectation of the Chief's attendance unless an emergency arises.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

- Confirmed that the office would communicate with the Chief's office regarding his attendance.
- Expressed hope that the Chief will attend as he has indicated.

Jonathan Maples (District 2):

- Clarified that the board is not expressing worry but reflecting on historical attendance patterns of past chiefs.
- Emphasized that the new Chief deserves a fair opportunity to make changes without prejudice.
- Encouraged all board members to prepare two or three questions for the Tuesday meeting, regardless of their position on the letter.

Chairman John M Davidson (District 15)

- Requested board members submit their questions to the office by Sunday evening.
- Designated Waldir Guerrero as the point of contact for question submissions, advising members to CC the director as well.

Adjournment:

- Chairman called for a motion to adjourn.
- Timothy Jackson (District 7): Made a motion to adjourn the meeting.
- Judge Victor Lander (District 8): Seconded the motion.
- Call for a vote: The motion passed unanimously.

I. Call to Order & Roll Call **(Chairman John Mark Davidson)**

Chairman Davidson begins the meeting at 5:30 pm and proceeds with a roll call.

II. Purpose of the CPOB **(Chairman John Mark Davidson)**

a. The mission of the Community Police Oversight Board (CPOB), formerly known as the Civilian Review Board, is to enhance the public's trust that complaints of misconduct against Dallas Police Department (DPD) employees are conducted fairly and thoroughly, are transparent and ensure the City of Dallas residents have an accessible means to the complaint process. To help ensure this accountability, the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) provides functional support and technical assistance to the CPOB.

Chairman Davidson states that the Police Chief has a prior engagement and needs to leave soon. With no objection from the board, the Chief's introduction would go next. There was no objection from the board.

III. Chief Daniel D. Comeaux Introduction to CPOB **(Chief Comeaux)**

a. On April 23, 2024, Dallas City Manager Kimberly Bizer Tolbert appointed Daniel Comeaux as the new Dallas Police Department Chief. Comeaux's appointment follows a national search; He brings 33 years of law enforcement experience, including 13 years with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). He previously served as the DEA's Special Agent in Charge of the Houston Field Division.

Chairman Davidson: Commenced this agenda item by stating he would read something just handed to him before Chief Comeaux was introduced to remind the board members that the Texas Open Meetings Act requires advance public notice of topics to be discussed. The purpose of this portion of the meeting was to introduce the Community Police Oversight Board (CPOB) to Chief Comeaux and welcome him to the City of Dallas. Chairman Davidson encouraged board members to keep their questions clear and within the scope of learning more about the Chief. The Chair also acknowledged the presence of Mr. Artis, recognizing his significance to the Dallas community. A brief pause was noted before the Chair planned to return to the microphone following the introductions.

Chief Dominique Artis: Introduced Chief Comeaux on behalf of City Manager Kimberly Tolbert, who was unable to attend. He noted that Chief Comeaux is a 33-year law enforcement veteran with extensive experience in various leadership roles. His career has emphasized intelligence-driven crime reduction, inter-agency collaboration, and officer development. Chief Comeaux's vision for the Dallas Police Department includes enhancing recruitment, implementing innovative

crime-fighting strategies, and building public trust to keep Dallas safe and forward-thinking.

Chairman Davidson: Following his introduction, Chief Comeaux was formally welcomed by the Chairman on behalf of the Community Police Oversight Board. The Chair expressed appreciation for Chief Comeaux's presence, extended a warm welcome to the City of Dallas, and acknowledged confidence in the City Manager's decision to appoint him. The Chair noted the significance of Chief Comeaux's arrival during a time of unrest and transition in the city and emphasized the Board's interest in learning about his vision for public safety.

Chairman Davidson invited Board members to introduce themselves and ask the Chief questions about his background, leadership philosophy, and goals for the Dallas Police Department. It was acknowledged that the Chief may not be able to respond to all questions immediately and that this meeting marks the beginning of an ongoing dialogue. Each of the 15 Board members was allotted 3–5 minutes to speak, following a format used in previous meetings.

Brandon Friedman, District 14: Invites Chief Comeaux to commence with an opening statement.

Chief Comeaux acknowledged the recent protest activity in Dallas, noting that officers faced dangerous conditions, including rocks, bottles, and fireworks being thrown at them. He expressed pride in the officers' professionalism and restraint, highlighting that only one arrest was made despite the circumstances. The Chief commended the Dallas Police Department's response as a demonstration of strength and discipline. He reiterated his enthusiasm for leading the department and shared that his approach in the first 90 days will focus on listening, learning, and observing before implementing changes aimed at improvement.

Timothy Jackson, District 7: Board member Jackson welcomed Chief Comeaux to the City of Dallas and expressed a desire to establish a strong, transparent relationship between the Board and the Chief's office. Acknowledging that oversight can sometimes create tension, the member asked what steps the Board can take to encourage open communication and ensure ongoing access and responsiveness from the Chief beyond this initial meeting. The emphasis of the comment was on building trust and maintaining consistent dialogue.

Chief Comeaux: In response, the Chief emphasized that his decisions are guided by doing what is right and in accordance with the law, policies, and procedures of the City of Dallas. He stated that the law is

not discretionary and must be followed consistently. Chief Comeaux committed to maintaining open and respectful dialogue, describing himself as approachable and present. He encouraged engagement on difficult issues as a way to improve and strengthen the department. He also praised the Dallas Police Department's response during the recent protest, noting national recognition for their professionalism.

David Kitner, District 13: Mr. Kitner thanked Chief Comeaux for attending and extended a warm welcome, encouraging him to attend CPOB meetings regularly, as Major Greer and his team consistently do. He emphasized the importance of the Chief's presence as a sign of departmental support and openness to dialogue. Referencing the relationship previously built with Chief Garcia, Mr. Kitner expressed hope that Chief Comeaux would continue efforts to strengthen understanding between the Board and police officers. Board member Kitner asked what steps the Chief would take to build internal support within the ranks for the Board's oversight role, clarifying that the Board's goal is accountability and collaboration, not punishment.

Chief Comeaux: In response, Chief Comeaux reaffirmed his commitment to doing what is right, stating, "We know right from wrong. We know the policies, and we just need to follow them." He emphasized the importance of removing emotion from decision-making and focusing on integrity and accountability. The Chief expressed support for oversight, saying, "I'm not afraid of the Oversight Committee... It's 2025, we should have one." He concluded by highlighting the need for mutual respect and understanding between the police department and the Board to serve the best interests of Dallas.

David Kitner, District 13: Board member Kitner concluded his remarks by again extending an open invitation to Chief Comeaux to attend Board meetings regularly. He expressed that the Chief's consistent presence would help build credibility and strengthen the relationship between the Board and Dallas police officers.

Brandon Friedman, District 14: Thanked Chief Comeaux and the Dallas Police Department for their professionalism and restraint during the recent protest, noting appreciation for the handling of the situation, which resulted in only one arrest. He then shifted focus to concerns about collaboration with federal agencies on immigration enforcement. While acknowledging the Chief's recent statement that the DPD's role has not changed, Friedman clarified that his concern lies with the actions of federal agencies such as DHS and ICE, rather than with the Dallas Police Department itself.

As Mr. Friedman was asking his question, he was interjected by Mr.

Moore from the City Attorney's Office.

Mr. Moore (City Attorney's Office): interrupted the discussion by clarifying the limitations of the posted agenda, stating, "Getting into specific policies, federal, state, or local, is beyond the scope of what was noticed on the agenda."

Brandon Friedman, District 14: Sought to ask the chief questions related to immigration and policy direction. He stated, "This is information we need to find out as part of an introduction."

Mr. Moore, representing the City Attorney's Office, advised that the posted agenda limited discussion to general introductory topics and did not allow for specific policy matters. He explained, "The introduction has to cover generalized topics... Specific issues would've had to be noticed." He further cited Dallas City Code Chapter 8-28, noting that the board must adhere to legal opinions unless overruled by a court.

When asked what could be discussed, Mr. Moore clarified that acceptable topics included background information and the Chief's general philosophy or vision for the department. He emphasized, "Once you start getting into specific policies, that is beyond the scope of what was noticed."

Brandon Friedman, District 14: Expressed concern about the limited scope, saying, "I'm not sure I see much value in this unless we can ask specific questions." He suggested calling a special meeting within 72 hours to address those issues.

Chairman Davidson acknowledged the concerns and indicated he would consult with the Director during the meeting, while Alison Grinter Allen, District 9, asked her question to explore next steps.

Brandon Friedman, District 14: Requested an executive session to further discuss agenda limitations. **Chairman Davidson** declined and redirected to allow Board Member **Alison Grinter Allen (District 9)** to proceed with her remarks while he consulted with the Director on potential next steps.

Alison Grinter Allen, District 9: Welcomed Chief Comeaux and emphasized the city's diversity and the importance of transparency in partnerships between law enforcement agencies. She stated her intent to remain within legal boundaries while still raising meaningful questions.

Grinter Allen asked the Chief about his professional background with

federal agencies, particularly the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

Chief Comeaux shared his extensive DEA service across various U.S. cities, concluding in Houston. He confirmed, “I worked for the Drug Enforcement Administration for 28 plus years,” and highlighted successful collaborations between federal, state, and local agencies, including a recent child pornography investigation.

When asked about challenges in agency cooperation, **Chief Comeaux** acknowledged disagreements can occur but stressed the importance of legality in joint efforts. In response to a question on officer discretion and holding partners accountable, he stated, “We wouldn’t collaborate with them if they were breaking the law... it’s our duty... to let someone know the law’s being broken.”

Board member **Grinter Allen** thanked the Chief for his transparency and affirmed her support for his commitment to lawful partnerships: “I’m really glad to hear you say that DPD will not be collaborating with agencies that are breaking the law.”

Chairman Davidson concluded the discussion by reiterating the board’s respect for legal guidance and limitations. He informed the Chief that further questions would be reserved for a future meeting, stating, “We want to respect the city’s guidance and adhere to the law.” He emphasized the board’s intent to build a strong, collaborative relationship and referred to a letter previously sent to the Chief. The Vice Chair was then invited to share key concerns from the board.

Ozzie Smith, Vice Chairman (District 1): Acknowledged that the meeting did not proceed as expected due to limitations on discussing specific policy issues. He emphasized the importance of public engagement and transparency, stating, “It’s essential that we highlight this during our meeting.”

Smith referenced a letter previously sent to Chief Comeaux containing six pages of questions and requested a response within 24 to 48 hours. He summarized several key topics from the letter, including:

- Challenges with the Internal Executive Division (IED) complaint process
- Interaction and data-sharing with the Office of Community Police Oversight
- Racial disparities, equitable enforcement, and immigration policy

- Evaluation of misdemeanor enforcement and potential resource reallocation
- Emergency response times, especially for Priority 1 and Priority 2 calls
- Clarification on DPD's officer recruitment in light of the HERO amendment
- Policies governing drone use and surveillance, including privacy safeguards and FAA compliance

Smith reiterated that although these issues could not be fully discussed at this meeting, they remain high priorities for the board.

Chairman Davidson then addressed recent protests, asking Chief Comeaux to share his general approach to public safety in such events. Davidson noted, "We're hoping and praying that the situation doesn't escalate here in our city."

Chief Comeaux commended DPD's response to the protests, stating, "I feel like the Dallas Police Department handled themselves very well... even if you're protesting, we are here to protect you as long as you do it by the laws."

He closed by reaffirming DPD's commitment to safety: "The number one priority for the police department is going to be to keep everyone in Dallas safe." He cited a recent operation in which 98 individuals with felony warrants were arrested, noting their collective history of over 700 prior arrests.

Chairman Davidson thanked Chief Comeaux and Chief Artis for attending and emphasized the board's commitment to continued dialogue and preparation for a future meeting to address the unanswered questions.

IV. Public Comment / Open Microphone (3 Minutes Per Person)

- b. During the open microphone period at the beginning of each Board meeting, up to five people are allowed to speak. Public comment must relate to the Board's jurisdiction and doesn't include the right to engage in dialogue. Those who wish to speak must register before the meeting begins. Speaker registration will open 15 minutes prior to the start of the Board meeting. The first five registered speakers will be called in the order they signed up to speak at the beginning of the meeting.

Delores Philips addressed the board regarding what she described as a long-standing pattern of misconduct, document fabrication, and cover-ups by law enforcement and oversight entities. She stated she had provided handouts and referenced a specific police report number, stating that the report had been prewritten prior to a scheduled interaction with a corporal.

She alleged that:

- Emergency call records were erased in 2009 but were later recovered in 2011, indicating an initial cover-up.
- A 2013 meeting arranged by then-Mayor Rollins resulted in her involuntary commitment and further alleged document fabrication, including pharmaceutical records.
- She and her family have been subject to retaliation, including the targeting and mistreatment of her incapacitated father, which she believes contributed to his premature death.
- There have been attempts to interfere with her family's legal and estate matters.
- She accused the oversight board of selectively addressing complaints and stated, "You are operating under color of law... you should follow the law."

Ms. Phillips concluded by stating she would seek special and punitive damages and had signed up to speak again at the next meeting.

During her comments, Chairman Davidson indicated to Philips that her time was up, and she continued despite being asked to conclude. Philips exited the council chambers, speaking loudly prior to imminent removal from the council chambers for non-compliance.

"Justice for Erica" | Dianna Munoz: Diana Munoz, a lifelong Dallas resident from District 9 and known as "Justice for Erica," addressed the board to speak on behalf of her daughter, Erica, who was murdered on Thanksgiving Day in 2014. Ms. Munoz shared her ongoing grief and frustration, noting that ten years later, she still has no autopsy report or resolution in the case. She criticized the Dallas Police Department's communication, citing a tweet from Detective Eric Barnes on April 30, 2025, announcing the case had gone cold, and an inaccurate Instagram post that first informed her of her daughter's status as critically missing. Ms. Munoz stated that communication from the DPD has been minimal, with no updates since 2021, despite prior suspects being in custody. She called on Chief Comeaux to respond to her formal complaint submitted on May 28, 2025, and to take direct action to ensure accountability and justice in her daughter's case. Ms. Munoz emphasized the broader impact of gun violence, noting that many other families in Dallas share her pain. She urged leadership to act decisively for justice and community safety.

Scott McWilliams, a resident of Expo Park and business owner near Baylor Medical Center, spoke in strong support of Dallas's immigrant community, calling it "a jewel to be protected." He highlighted their cultural and familial contributions to the city and noted that 43% of Dallas households speak a language other than English. McWilliams cited data showing that immigrant communities commit significantly fewer violent and property crimes and expressed concern over current ICE practices, which he said remove individuals from communities without due process. He stated, "ICE is now part of a machine that gives non-criminals life sentences in countries in which they've never lived." McWilliams urged the Dallas Police Department not to cooperate with these efforts when no violent crime is involved, warning that such actions could do irreparable harm to community trust. He hopes to hear more about this topic in the future.

Dominique Alexander: Expressed frustration over what he perceives as repeated efforts by the City Attorney's Office to limit the independence and authority of the Community Police Oversight Board. He criticized what he called "loose interpretations" of city rules and ordinances, particularly regarding the board's ability to conduct independent investigations, despite the ordinance referencing the board's independence multiple times. Alexander voiced concern that this pattern undermines the board's role and silences community voices, referring to the city attorneys' earlier interjection. He also criticized the board for not addressing current issues, such as recent protests and the experiences of migrant communities, and cautioned against what he described as "controlled narratives." He urged board members not to allow outside entities to restrict their work, stating, "Each and every one of you has a responsibility to the constituents of Dallas to make sure that your voice is never silenced."

Walter "Changa" Higgins, District 3: Board member Higgins expressed strong frustration with the City Attorney's Office, stating that despite attending multiple meetings and hearing the board's concerns and intentions, the City Attorney failed to ensure the agenda reflected the topics the board wanted to address, particularly policy questions for the Chief of Police. Higgins criticized the City Attorney's office for informing the board only at the onset of the meeting that such questions could not be asked, calling the timing unacceptable and stating, "You see what our agenda looks like... and then you come in here tonight and tell us that we can't ask him questions about policy." Higgins argued that the board was being set up to fail and that this pattern contributes to public misperceptions that the board operates under the police department. Higgins concluded by calling for independent legal counsel, citing a conflict of interest and stating an intention to raise the issue with the Dallas City Council.

Chairman Davidson: Also expressed disappointment that the questions prepared for Chief Comeaux to answer could not be addressed.

Loren Gilbert Smith, District 4: Expressed agreement with Mr. Higgins and his concerns about the City Attorney's Office, stating, "I believe it was a setup." Gilbert Smith emphasized that board members are unpaid citizens who dedicated

significant time across three meetings and a special Friday evening session to prepare a letter and questions for the Chief of Police. Despite this effort, no guidance was provided to ensure the agenda would allow those discussions to take place. Gilbert Smith reiterated the belief that the board was intentionally set up to be restricted and concluded by thanking the board.

Victor Lander, District 8: Voiced strong disappointment with the City Attorney's actions, stating that the attorney failed in his duty to advise the board and instead contributed to what was described as a deliberate setup to prevent the board from carrying out its planned actions. Speaking as a lawyer, former judge, and board member, Mr. Lander emphasized his dissatisfaction and stated that, if necessary, the board should seek private legal counsel.

Jonathan Maples, District 2: Strongly agreed with prior comments, stating, "I am absolutely disappointed." Maples criticized the lack of guidance from the City Attorney and noted that despite the agenda being finalized and published 72 hours in advance, no issues were raised beforehand. He expressed frustration that the board's efforts were undermined, saying, "We wasted all these people's time and this broadcast all over local news that this was going to happen, and look what happened." Maples added that the Chief's limited availability and the board not meeting in July could mean no further engagement for the rest of the year. He concluded by stating he was "pissed off to no means."

Brandon Friedman, District 14: In response to Member Maples' remarks, proposed a potential solution to the board's ongoing concerns. He suggested that the board "create an agenda that includes every single question" and "schedule a meeting every 72 hours until the Chief shows up." Friedman stated he did not believe this approach would violate any city rules.

Chairman Davidson stated that as a board "we will find a way".

Alison Grinter-Allen, District 9: Emphasized the importance of public engagement with the Chief of Police, stating, "The people don't want to just read his résumé. The people want to know who is policing them." She stressed that leadership sets the tone for department culture and that the community deserves answers to their legitimate questions. She concluded by stating, "If the rules of this meeting don't serve the people getting answers, then the rules of the meeting are not serving the people."

Timothy Jackson, District 7: Also expressed disappointment with the outcome of the meeting and stated that the board was "set up to fail." Jackson noted that one reason for initially opposing the idea of sending a letter was the expectation that the Chief would attend and address concerns publicly. He emphasized that, although he may not always agree with other board members, "this did feel like a setup." Jackson stated that the City Attorney's awareness of the agenda and failure to support the board's efforts prevented board members from presenting their "genuine, valid concerns." He described the situation as unfair and reiterated his disappointment in how the meeting was handled.

V. Approval of May 13, 2025, CPOB Regular Meeting Minutes

- **Motion:** J. Victor Lander, District 8, moves to approve the minutes.

- **Second:** Loren Gilbert Smith, District 4, seconds the motion.
- **Vote:** The motion passes unanimously.

VI. Briefing and Overview of the Mediation Program (Policy Analyst Siara O.)

- a. The Mediation Program is an alternative to traditional investigative procedures for resolving minor misconduct complaints. Authorized under Dallas City Code, Article III, Chapter 37 § 37-32.2 (“Ord. 31192”), this program provides a collaborative, respectful setting for community members and police officers to address concerns directly.

Siara Obasuyi, OCPO Policy Analyst: Obasuyi, presented an overview of the City of Dallas’s inaugural Mediation Program, developed in partnership with the Internal Affairs Division. The voluntary program offers a confidential, non-adversarial alternative to address minor misconduct complaints through facilitated dialogue between community members and DPD officers. The program includes eligibility criteria, a structured mediation process, and proposed enhancements such as reduced waiting periods and officer participation options. Next steps include public education, pilot sessions, and data-driven evaluation to support long-term implementation. Ms. Obasuyi turns over the floor to the Director and Major Greer for further comment.

Director Andre: Highlighted the collaborative launch of the Mediation Program with DPD’s Internal Affairs Division to address minor misconduct complaints. Though authorized since 2019, Director Andre noted that “no successful mediation has occurred,” but the office is “on track to complete two successful mediations by year’s end.” She emphasized the program’s focus on “healing, understanding, and restoration over punitive action,” and its role in promoting transparency, trust, and community empowerment. Andre called the initiative “a powerful example of what’s possible when oversight and internal accountability work hand in hand” and described it as “an investment in the future of policing in Dallas.” Director Andre proceeded to turn over the time to IAD Major Greer for Comment.

Major Anthony Greer, expressed strong support for the mediation program, calling it the initiative he is “more excited [about] than all the things we’ve done so far.” Although the mediation program has existed in the City Code, Greer noted that “the city has never mediated one single case.” He emphasized that completing even one successful mediation would be “a win” and a major step toward building community trust. Greer described mediation as “the ultimate in transparency,” highlighting the power of direct dialogue over formal investigations. He concluded by affirming continued collaboration with the board and community stakeholders, stating, “It’s not gonna be if, but when we get it done.”

Chairman Davidson opens the segment to the Board for any questions.

Jennifer King, District 10: Thanked Major Greer, Sierra, and Director Andre for their presentation on the mediation program, calling it “exciting” and expressing hope for the success of the pilot sessions. She inquired whether the program was modeled after existing programs elsewhere or uniquely developed and asked how it would be introduced to rank-and-file officers to ensure understanding and comfort with the process.

Major Greer: Stated that conversations are underway with both officers and community members to ensure mutual understanding and support. “It has to be 50/50,” with buy-in from both sides for the mediation program to succeed. The Office of Community Police Oversight will also disseminate information to the public to build awareness and engagement as the program moves forward.

Director Andre: The mediation program is not modeled after a specific existing program but builds on Dallas’s ordinance. Some elements were adapted from other cities, such as Albany’s intake question about mediation interest and Philadelphia’s officer commendation letter. Unique aspects to Dallas include offering neutral locations like libraries or recreation centers and allowing officers to choose between wearing uniforms or plain clothes.

David Kitner, District 13: Also noted that while the mediation program has existed in the ordinance for nearly six years, no mediations have occurred, largely due to a lack of officer incentive. He asked what had changed to encourage officer participation and expressed support for the program’s success.

Major Greer: In response, the Major explained that the mediation program offers officers an alternative to receiving summary discipline for minor violations. Participating in mediation could resolve the complaint and prevent formal disciplinary action, or investigation, providing a clear incentive for officer involvement.

Director Andre: Also added that the officer would get two hrs. of overtime.

J. Victor Lander, District 8: Praised the mediation program and asked where are the mediators coming from?

Director Andre: Stated that the program will contract with external mediators, noting, “We think that it’s gonna be best to have somebody that’s neutral from either party.”

It was clarified by Ms. Obasuyi that both the officer and the complainant may bring a support person, such as a lawyer, friend, or association representative, but these individuals will not be allowed in the mediation room. Only the officer, the complainant, and the neutral mediator will participate directly in the session. J. Lander, expressed strong support for the program, stating, “I think it’s an excellent idea.”

Walter “Changa” Higgins: Board Member Higgins thanked Major Greer and his team for their ongoing collaboration and transparency, noting that Greer’s commitment to engaging the board before finalizing the mediation program

exemplifies the kind of partnership the board values. He emphasized the board's role as a stakeholder in fostering public trust, stating, "We're not on a witch hunt... we want to do our job as oversight."

Jonathan Maples, District 2: Expressed strong support for the mediation program, stating he is "pulling for it" and appreciates the effort after six years of inaction. He inquired about officers wearing uniforms during mediation and agreed that the option to appear out of uniform "takes the walls down" and helps humanize the process. Mr. Maples praised the team for their work and expressed optimism for the program's success.

J. Victor Lander, District 8: Recommended reaching out to local legal organizations such as the Jail Alternative Legal Association and the Hispanic Bar Association to enlist volunteer mediators, noting that "these mediators do not necessarily need to be contracted but can volunteer their services." He commended the team's efforts and expressed appreciation for the support from police officers, calling the program "a fantastic idea."

David Kitner, District 13: Stated appreciation to Major Greer and Director Michele Andre, stating the progress made is "night and day from where we were before." He emphasized that the collaboration demonstrates mutual buy-in and support, adding, "It's heartening to see this kind of progress."

VII. Office of Community Police Oversight Director Michele Andre and Staff Report

Director's Report – Michele Andre

Budget Update:

- On May 27, OCPO presented four program proposals to the City Manager's Budget Office.
- Additional information was requested on the *Community Outreach Program*.

Chairman Davidson opened the segment to any questions or comments the board may have at this time.

Jennifer King, District 10: Invited fellow board members to attend the Hamilton Park Juneteenth Celebration on Saturday, June 21, from 1 to 5 p.m., where the board will host an information table. She thanked Alma Perez and the OCPO team in advance for their participation. King also encouraged attendance at the June 26 community meeting at the Willie B. Johnson Recreation Center, describing it as an opportunity to “meet the director and build a relationship with this board,” highlighting the importance of community education and outreach. She concluded by requesting to join the upcoming Northeast Division ride-along, which will take place in her district.

a. Special Investigator Report (Special Investigator Greg Huff)
 Investigator Huff briefed the board on the Zaharko-Guanajuato and Samad cases so that they could vote on the recommendations provided in the reports.

i. OCPO Independent Investigation

1. NI2025-0128 Tiffanie Zaharko-Guanajuato

a. Action: Vote on the findings and/or recommendations of the independent investigation for Case No. NI2025-0128.

Investigator Huff: Gave a briefing of the case and

summary of findings to the CPOB for the board to vote.

Major Greer: Provided additional information about the account regarding this case being initiated as a CIT (Crisis Intervention Team) call involving a family violence incident, emphasizing that it was dispatched as a Priority One call requiring lights, sirens, and supervisor presence. The Right Care Team responded, and upon arrival, officers found the woman, referred to as Ms. Tiffany, with self-inflicted wounds, while the male complainant had fled the home and alleged she was possibly armed. He also provided officers with video evidence of the assault.

Based on department policy, which requires arrest in family violence situations to prevent further harm, officers arrested Ms. Tiffany after reviewing the video. During transport and medical treatment, she made no mention of being assaulted herself.

Greer noted that the complaint against officers was filed more than seven months after the incident, well beyond the typical 60-day reporting window, and it was still reviewed. He stressed that the officers handled the situation with professionalism and empathy, consistent with their training, and that video footage confirmed their respectful conduct. He concluded by stating: "If I was there right now today, I would make the same decision," reaffirming his view that the officers "did a great job on it for what it was."

The board discussed a case involving a delayed complaint of alleged domestic violence. It was clarified that the complainant waited seven months to file her Internal Affairs complaint, reportedly due to pending criminal charges being dropped. Major Greer confirmed that during initial police contact, transport, and hospital evaluation, the complainant made no mention of being assaulted. He explained that in cases involving both criminal allegations and mental health concerns, the criminal conduct takes precedence, though Right Care did remain involved.

Investigator Huff emphasized the OCPO's stance that while the arrest itself wasn't deemed improper, the investigation was incomplete. Officers failed to interview the complainant during the initial incident, missing the opportunity to gather a full account of events. He noted that

the video evidence presented by the male complainant was brief and did not show the entire interaction. Huff stated that it is standard protocol to ask both parties for statements in domestic violence cases to ensure proper assessment of who the aggressor was.

Several board members expressed concern about the lack of an initial interview with the complainant and discussed how trauma may affect a person's ability to disclose abuse. There was general agreement that while officers followed protocol in some respects, additional steps should have been taken to ensure a thorough investigation. The discussion concluded with a motion to approve Investigator Huff's findings.

2. NI2024-1209 Abdul Samad

a. Action: Vote on the findings and/or recommendations of the independent investigation for Case No. NI2024-1209.

Investigator Huff: Gave a briefing of the case and summary of findings to the CPOB for the board to vote.

The time is open for the board to submit questions. The board

reviewed the complaint by Abdul Samad, who alleged that officers failed to document a possible driver switch and threats made by a third party during a vehicle collision. Body-worn camera footage confirmed that Samad informed officers of the switch and threats, but the official reports omitted this. OCPO found that both involved officers failed to fully investigate the incident, and the findings were sustained. Discussion followed about report-writing standards, missed documentation, and the impact of officers declining interviews with OCPO investigators.

Jonathan Maples, District 2: Board Member Maples expressed deep concern over racial disparities in monthly arrest data, highlighting that of 3,216 total arrests, 2,614 involved Black and Hispanic individuals compared to 574 white individuals. He questioned whether this reflects over-policing and stated that, despite previous analysis, the persistent

imbalance remains troubling and unacceptable to him.

Derric Pegram, District 6 comments on wondering how these numbers will change in his district once ICE is released in his area.

Walter “Changa” Higgins: Board Member Higgins stated that reviewing the disproportionate arrest data each month feels like “Groundhog Day” and urged the board to reflect on actionable steps. While acknowledging the board’s limited authority, he emphasized its ability to “inquire, analyze, and request” information. He proposed a future discussion with the office to determine what the board can do or request to better understand and address the disparities.

Jennifer King, District 10: Agreed with prior comments and suggested holding a future internal meeting with staff, Major Greer, and Chief Comeaux to discuss community trust and transparency, and also adding to a future agenda. She emphasized the importance of the police department actively demonstrating transparency, stating, “I think it’s a matter of improving the trust between the community and the police department.” She acknowledged Major Greer’s clear communication but noted that Chief Comeaux’s messaging could be improved. She also agreed to suggest that this discussion about disparities be added as a future agenda item.

- Siara Obasuyi Presented on **Senate Bill 2570**, which:

- Establishes legal justification for use of less lethal force by peace officers and correctional guards.
- Requires “**reasonable belief**” and **substantial compliance with training** for lawful use.
- Becomes effective **September 1, 2025**.
- May require DPD to revise use-of-force and crowd management policies to avoid liability and maintain public trust.
- **Question raised** on whether DPD could update policies within 90 days; Major Greer confirmed: “If it needs to be done within that period of time, we’ll get it done.”

Legislative Update Summary:

- **89th Texas Legislature** tracked by OCPO:
 - **13 bills monitored**, four passed, 9 failed.
 - Bills passed and are taking effect:
 - **SB 1957** – Clarifies eligibility for civilian oversight boards.
 - **SB 2570** – (Covered above).
 - **SB 1637** – Exempts peace officers from deadly conduct prosecution under certain conditions.
 - **SB 8** – Requires the sheriff to pursue an ICE agreement; may increase immigration enforcement.
- **SB 8 Discussion:**
 - Although not directly affecting DPD, it may impact Dallas residents and ICE practices.
 - Obasi recommended community outreach and “**Know Your Rights**” education.

Board Feedback:

- **Judge Lander, Jennifer King, Jonathn Maples:** Praised Obasi and OCPO for their legislative tracking and real-time updates.

King: “Thank you for making it easy to understand and for looking out for the City of Dallas.”

- **Board Member Maples:**
 - Asked about the future of failed bills (e.g., SB 781 and SB 2570 amendments).
 - Clarified: “So they’re not dead, they just died.”
- **Maples on SB 8:**

- Expressed concern: “I just see a big collision coming here with SB 8 and the Dallas Police Department and the Sheriff’s Department and the feds.”
- **Obasi Response:** Emphasized outreach and community education as the best strategy for mitigating the impact of SB 8.

Additional Board Comments:

- **Board Member Pegram:**
 - Disappointed **HB 2929** (police training on autism) didn’t pass. “That’s my babies on the spectrum.”
- **Board Member Jackson:**
 - Raised legal concerns on the Chief’s public statements regarding ICE enforcement.
 - “If the Chief says what we want to hear, does that open us up for litigation?”
- **City Attorney Moore (responding):**
 - Admitted difficulty in predicting how federal/state actors may interpret or weaponize laws.

Closing Remark: Jonathan Maples, District 2 “Advise your neighbors... anytime you don’t do what’s happening, [it] rolls downhill from Washington into Texas... they’re gonna make it hell to pay on that specific entity.”

Ms. Wadsworth, District 12: Requested to make a motion and, prior to doing so, summarized her reasoning. She referred to the approved minutes from the previous meeting, specifically page eight, which documented an extensive discussion about the role of the Dallas Police Department in immigration enforcement and the public comments made by the incoming Chief. She expressed concern that although these topics were publicly discussed and documented, the board was unexpectedly restricted from raising similar issues at the current meeting due to a lack of specificity in the posted agenda.

Ms. Wadsworth stated: “We wanted to know broad topics... not specific cases.”

She further noted that the City Attorney had not provided prior guidance to staff or the board on how specific the agenda item needed to be.

Motion by Ms. Wadsworth:

That the Director be required to submit the draft agenda for future meetings to the City Attorney’s Office **prior to public posting**, and that the City Attorney’s Office be required to **respond within 24 hours** with any necessary revisions or clarifications, particularly regarding the level of

specificity required to maintain compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Derric Pegram:

Who expressed concern regarding the lack of support for the board and referenced earlier remarks made by other board members regarding procedural obstructions.

Chairman Davidson clarified that the agenda is already reviewed by the City Attorney's Office and City Secretary's Office before posting.

Ms. Wadsworth responded: "So why was it a setup?"

Director Michele Andre: confirmed that she collaborates with the Board Chair in developing the meeting agenda. Once finalized, it is submitted by Waldir Guerrero, Communications Advisor and Board Coordinator, to the City Attorney and City Secretary for review. Adjustments, if any, are made before the agenda is posted within the 72-hour legal requirement.

Vice Chair Ozzie Smith, District 1: Raised concerns regarding the vague language used in the item, "Chief Daniel D. Comeaux – Introduction to CPOB," and suggested that future agenda items use clearer language, such as:

"Introduction and inquiry of various topics of interest by CPOB," to allow for interactive dialogue between the board and guest presenters.

Vice Chairman Smith requested that the City Attorney come forward in order to discuss the agenda submission process and what details are needed for future agendas.

City Attorney Daniel Moore: Informed the Vice Chair and board that, because the motion and discussion were not placed on the official agenda, he could not address the matter in detail during the meeting, citing Texas Open Meetings Act limitations. He offered to speak with individual board members after adjournment.

Timothy Jackson, District 7: Supported the discussion and recommended that the topic be added to the agenda for the next regular board meeting. The Chairman agreed with this suggestion and encouraged members to seek clarification from the attorney offline.

Dr. Loren Gilbert Smith, District 4: Raised a **point of order**, questioning how the motion could be discussed if the City Attorney could not respond.

Judge Victor Lander advised the Chair to formally **rule the motion out of order**.

Chairman Davidson: **Ruled the motion out of order**, stating that because it was **not on the agenda**, it could not be formally considered.

Ms. Wadsworth, District 12: Requested that both her original motion and the ruling be **included in the official meeting minutes**.

Chairman Davison proceeds to introduce the next item on the agenda, inviting Senior Outreach Specialist Alma Perez to come forward.

d. Community Engagement Report (Sr. Outreach Specialist Alma Perez)

Alma Perez, Senior Outreach Specialist, provided an update on the Office of Community Police Oversight's outreach activities during the month of May:

- The OCPO participated in seven community events, reaching over 670 residents across the City of Dallas.
- Outreach efforts prioritized geographic and experiential accessibility, with a focus on underserved neighborhoods across six City Council districts.
- A key highlight was the Family Fun Resource Day in District 8, which featured over 25 city and community vendors and drew 75 attendees. The event promoted safety and community connection. Ms. Perez thanked Board Member Jennifer King for attending.
- Ms. Perez also acknowledged OCPO's attendance at the Dallas Police Department's Gun Violence Awareness Day, which included a safety fair and unity prayer.
- She recognized the presence of Moms Demand Action members at the board meeting and expressed appreciation for their ongoing volunteer efforts, noting that June is Gun Violence Awareness Month.
- Looking ahead, OCPO will participate in two Juneteenth celebrations:
 - June 15th (Saturday) in District 2 from 10:00 AM – 6:00 PM.
 - June 21st in Hamilton Park (District 10).

Ms. Perez emphasized that these events serve as important opportunities for OCPO to connect with the community, provide education, and offer resources.

Chairman Davidson: Commended the Office of Community Police Oversight for its strong presence on social media, specifically on Instagram and Facebook. He encouraged board members and the public to follow the office's social media to stay informed about upcoming community events and outreach efforts.

Chairman Davidson thanked Alma Perez, Senior Outreach Specialist, for her ongoing commitment and visibility in the community, stating, "Thank you, Ms. Perez, for your hard work and your dedication to being the face

in the community."

Chairman Davidson opened the floor for questions, and none were brought up at this time.

VIII. Internal Affairs Division (IAD) Report

(Major Anthony Greer)

Major Anthony Greer: Reminded the Board that there is no scheduled meeting next month. Members were invited to tour the Internal Affairs Division (IAD) at their convenience during the current month. Major Greer noted that several members have already visited and emphasized that flexible arrangements can be made for anyone interested in attending. Nothing further.

Jennifer King, District 10: Stated she would be reaching out to Major Greer for a tour of Internal Affairs. Ms. King commended Senior Outreach Specialist Alma Perez for her outstanding work organizing the recent Community Resource Fair, noting that the Dallas Police Department was present in multiple capacities. King described the event as "very impressive" and praised Perez for handling "the whole kit and caboodle," adding, "She represented us well."

IX. Community Police Oversight Board Reports/ Briefings

a. Chairman Report

(Chairman Davidson)

Chairman John Mark Davidson: provided closing remarks, acknowledging that the meeting did not go as expected and expressing disappointment

regarding the surprise issues that arose. However, he reaffirmed the board's commitment to its mission, stating, "We will not be deterred by this... We will find a way to ask the right questions and get the answers we need, because we ultimately serve the people of Dallas, and that is our highest responsibility."

He also noted that although the item on subcommittees was removed from the agenda, the board's subcommittees continue to meet and carry out their work. Chairman Davidson commended the subcommittee chairs for their dedication and affirmed the board's intention to bring the policy discussion back to a future agenda.

The Chairman reminded the board and community members that, like the city council, the board will have a recess in July. Therefore, the board will not meet until August. Board Member Friedman requested to comment.

Brandon Friedman Motions: To hold a special meeting within 72 hours to meet with the Chief, and every 72 hours until the Chief complies with attending.

Brandon Friedman, District 14: Expressed urgency about recent events and moved to hold a special meeting within 72 hours to address unanswered questions for the Chief and include discussion of independent counsel. He stated for the record: "*We need to get this straightened out... as soon as possible.*" The motion did not receive a second and thus failed.

Jonathan Maples, District 2: shared he was unavailable until after July 4.

Chairman Davidson: Clarified that a formal motion is not required to call a meeting and committed to contacting board members individually to schedule one when a quorum is possible.

Judge Victor Lander, District 8: Stated for the record: "*I think we should meet in July, as early as possible.*" He later emphasized the need for a serious conversation with the City Attorney, not just the assistant, stating: "*This is not the Chief's fault... this is the fault of the City Attorney's Office.*"

Timothy Jackson, District 7: Expressed concern that repeated meeting demands could harm board credibility, stating for the record: "*Suggesting that we meet every 72 hours is extremely obsessive... We're not gonna get anywhere as a board being antagonistic to the Chief.*"

Branden Friedman, District 14: Reiterated he was not "wedded to 72 hours" but emphasized the need to act sooner than August.

Ozzie Smith (Vice Chair) District 1: Requested that OCPO Director Andre follow up to obtain responses to the board's previously submitted letter and questions.

Walter "Changa" Higgins, District 3: Supported urgent action, stating: "*It's not antagonistic to push as far as we need to push... If it's not the 72-hour thing, then it needs to be some other solution.*"

Chairman Davidson: Concluded the discussion, noting that he has the authority to call a special meeting and will follow up offline with board members.

Additionally, Chairman Davidson reported that Chief Comeaux approved a collaborative racial disparity study that will be conducted independently.

Director Andre: Clarified that the study will provide recommendations and is being conducted by an experienced external vendor.

Chairman Davidson proceeds to invite those signed in for public comment to come forward.

XI. Public Comment/Open Microphone (3 minutes Per Person)

Precious Sauls: A resident of District 1, addressed the board to request assistance regarding ongoing issues of alleged stalking, harassment, and abuse involving her landlord and others. She reported submitting multiple complaints to Internal Affairs, including one acknowledged by Anthony Greer, but has received little follow-up. Ms. Sauls described experiencing daily disturbances in her home, including lights being pointed at her, unwanted physical contact, and exposure to unknown odors. She expressed frustration with the police response, feeling dismissed due to her mental health diagnosis of paranoid schizophrenia. Ms. Sauls emphasized her desire to be treated with dignity and requested help to resolve the situation.

Cece Encarnacion: A community organizer, expressed concern over what she described as a pattern of excessive police presence and surveillance—such as drones and helicopters—at peaceful assemblies, rallies, and vigils held in public or private spaces. She cited a candlelight vigil she organized and a recent rally at the Ronald Kirk Pedestrian Bridge as examples, noting the presence of multiple officers, squad cars, and surveillance equipment. Encarnacion stated that such tactics create an atmosphere of intimidation and could discourage individuals from exercising their First Amendment rights.

Dianna Munoz: Thanked Alma Perez and Dallas PD for their work on the National Gun Violence Awareness Monthly Safety Fair. She shared that after losing her daughter and surviving gun violence on three occasions, she has dedicated herself to advocacy and volunteer work promoting responsible gun ownership and firearm safety. Munoz acknowledged her collaboration with various leaders and organizations, including Dr. Williams at Parkland, and expressed gratitude for the support she has received.

This memorandum provides an overview and analysis of the Dallas Police Department's arrest activity in Deep Ellum from January 2025 through June 2025, utilizing data categorized under the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). This report outlines trends and year-over-year comparisons.

To support this analysis, the report highlights two key data points for each offense category:

- **Count Difference:** The raw numerical difference in arrests between comparable periods from Year-to-Date 2025 vs. Year-to-Date 2024.
- **Percentage Change:** The relative increase or decrease over the same period illustrates the rate of change.



SUBJECT July 5, 2025, Officer Involved Shooting – Critical Incident #2025-004

On July 5, 2025, at approximately 2:20 AM, two groups of people became involved in a fight near the intersection of Commerce Street and Good-Latimer Expressway. At the conclusion of the altercation, one group walked away into the parking lot of 2600 Canton Street, followed by a second group that included Tevin Valentine. Multiple gunshots were exchanged between the two groups, resulting in four individuals being shot.

One of the victims, Christopher Lyons, approached police officers at 100 North Good Latimer and reported that his brother, Caylen Fritz, had also been shot. Officer Garza-Fuantos, a five-year veteran, and Officer Del Rio quickly responded to the shooting scene. They located a third victim, J'Vaughn Williams, before finding Caylen Fritz on the ground with Tevin Valentine standing over him, holding a handgun.

The officers issued verbal commands to Valentine, who then fled on foot. While escaping, he pointed the handgun at Officer Garza-Fuantos, who fired a single shot from his patrol rifle, striking Valentine in the abdomen. Valentine dropped the firearm and was subsequently apprehended by the police. He survived his injuries. The handgun that Valentine dropped had been reported stolen.

Caylen Fritz succumbed to his injuries, and a murder investigation is currently underway. The Dallas County District Attorney's Office responded and will conduct its own investigation into the officer-involved shooting. The Office of Community Police Oversight did not respond to the incident but was briefed by the Dallas Police Department.

SUBJECT July 9, 2025, Officer Involved Shooting – Critical Incident #2025-005

On July 9, 2025, at approximately 9:38 a.m., Jake Miller's roommate called 911 to report that Miller was experiencing alcohol withdrawal and possibly hallucinating. The roommate fled to her vehicle after Miller threatened her with a knife. Other callers also reported witnessing Miller cutting himself and kicking the door to another residence.

Officers arrived and found Miller in the 3000 block of Fairview Avenue. He was holding two large knives and was bleeding from his arms and neck. Miller ignored the officers' commands, prompting them to fire several rounds of pepper balls and deploy a taser, both of which had no effect. Miller then charged Officer Pargas, who fired four rounds from his handgun. Although Miller fell to the ground, he still held onto one of the knives, which had to be kicked out of his hand by the officers.

Officers provided first aid to Miller, who was transported to the hospital by ambulance, where he was later pronounced dead. An examination revealed that Miller had over 30 lacerations on each arm and a deep cut on his throat that extended to the muscle.

The Dallas County District Attorney's Office is conducting an independent investigation into the incident. The Office of Community Police Oversight responded to the incident and was briefed by the Dallas Police Department.

SUBJECT July 13, 2025, Death in Custody – Critical Incident #2025-006

On July 13, 2025, at approximately 3:48 p.m., 41-year-old Jerrell Johnson assaulted employees and demanded money in two different stores located in the 5600 block of Lemmon Avenue. Officers responded to the scene, with Officer Nauman being the first on the scene at 3:55 p.m. Officer Nauman found Johnson lying on his back in the parking lot and handcuffed him.

At 4:05 p.m., Officer Nauman requested an ambulance due to Johnson's inability to sit up on his own. Paramedics arrived at 4:17 p.m., and Johnson was placed in the ambulance at 4:27 p.m. The ambulance arrived at Parkland Hospital at 4:52 p.m., and Johnson was declared deceased at 5:07 p.m.

At the hospital, Detectives learned that Johnson had been treated earlier that morning for a drug overdose and released from the hospital at 2:07 p.m.

The Dallas Police Special Investigations Unit responded to and is investigating the incident. Additionally, the Dallas County District Attorney's Office is conducting an independent investigation into the matter. The Office of Community Police Oversight responded to the incident and was briefed by the Dallas Police Department.

SUBJECT July 27, 2025, Officer Involved Shooting – Critical Incident #2025-007

On July 27, 2025, at approximately 2:15 a.m., Bryan Cruz was involved in an altercation with another subject outside Club 2009, 10701 Finnell Street. Cruz produced a handgun and fired one round, which grazed the other subject.

Sgt. Gunter heard the gunshot and saw Cruz and the other subject in an altercation. When Sgt. Gunter gave Cruz commands to drop the gun, he fled on foot. Sgt. Gunter put a description of the suspect on the radio.

Officer Keenan Anderson heard the radio broadcast and encountered Cruz, who was still holding the gun, in the parking lot. Officer Anderson gave Cruz commands to drop the gun. Cruz lifted the weapon, and Officer Anderson fired one round, striking Cruz in the right shoulder.

Cruz fled through the parking lot and dropped the gun. Cruz stopped and attempted to pick up the gun, at which time Officer Anderson fired one round, missing Cruz. Cruz then lay down on the ground. Cruz resisted being arrested while on the ground and had to be tased by Officer Anderson to get him in custody.

Once in custody, first aid was administered, and Dallas Fire Rescue transported Cruz to Parkland Hospital, where he was treated.

The Dallas County District Attorney's Office is investigating the incident independently. The Office of Community Police Oversight responded to the incident and was briefed by the Dallas Police Department.

Executive Summary

I. Background

On November 23, 2024, complainant Devon Leach submitted an allegation against Senior Corporal Matthew Wolford (#11295), claiming that during a traffic stop, the officer saw a holstered firearm in the vehicle and stated, **"I will smoke you"** (**Attachment B**).

The Internal Affairs Division (IAD) referred this complaint to Corporal Wolford's Division for investigation, which is commonly referred to as a Division Referral. The Findings of Corporal Wolford's actions were labeled as EXONERATED; however, they included the need for training for Corporal Wolford. Due to this contradiction of an exonerated finding and a need for training, the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) requested IAD to review the finding again.

The IAD sent the investigation back to the Division for review. The Division kept the exonerated finding; however, it removed Corporal Wolford's need for training. The explanation given was that Corporal Wolford's actions were within policy.

II. Investigation Scope

The OCPO reviewed the initial complaint, which was filed under case number EC2024-1320. The Internal Affairs Division changed the case number to DR2024-169 when the complaint was sent to the Division for investigation. The documents in these case files included a statement from Corporal Wolford. The OCPO also reviewed the Body-Worn Camera (BWC) and dash camera footage of the traffic stop. Complainant Devon Leach did not provide a statement to the OCPO.

There were two policy sections that were analyzed for their application to this incident:

Code of Conduct, Section 4.14: No employee shall use loud or harsh language in performance of official duties except as necessary to gain control of an escalating situation.

Code of Conduct, Section 4.15: No employee shall use indecent or profane language in the performance of official duties or in the presence of the public

12:10:33 Corporal Wolford makes contact with driver Leach in his vehicle. The following verbal exchange occurs:

- **Corporal Wolford:** *How you doing today, sir?*
- **Driver (Leach):** *[Unintelligible response]*
- **Corporal Wolford:** *Doing well. Is there an emergency today?*
- **Driver:** *[Unintelligible response]*
- **Corporal Wolford:** *Let me get the driver's license. Make sure you keep your — actually —*
- **Driver:** *You want me to move it?*
- **Corporal Wolford:** *No, don't even touch it.*
- **Driver:** *Yes, sir.*
- **Corporal Wolford:** *If you touch it, I'm gonna smoke your ass. I'm just gonna be real with you, okay.*
- **Driver:** *I've never been pulled over before.*
- **Corporal Wolford:** *Put your hands up on top of the steering wheel for me. Gimmie that (takes driver's license). Keep your hands on the steering wheel. If they move, we're going to have big problems. Okay.*



- 12:10:55** Corporal Wolford explains the reason for the stop and asks about his license plate cover.
- 12:11:35** Corporal Wolford steps to the front of Leach's truck to look at the front license plate.
- 12:15:29** Corporal Wolford concludes the stop by issuing tickets to Leach.

Dash Cam – Corporal Wolford's Vehicle (Attachment D)

- 12:11:47** Corporal Wolford walks to his patrol vehicle from the traffic stop, with his back towards the driver.
- 12:14:57** Corporal Wolford walks towards the driver, pauses at the rear of the driver's vehicle, and motions for him to put his hands out the window. He then continues to the driver's window.
- 12:15:28** Corporal Wolford concludes the interaction with the driver and walks to his patrol vehicle with his back to the driver.

Dallas Police Internal Affairs Investigation

On December 30, 2024, the IAD determined this complaint would best be handled as a Division Referral and sent a letter to Leach (**Attachment E**). The complaint was then sent to Division Supervisor Sgt. Gladney to investigate.

Division Referral

Sgt. Justin Gladney obtained an interview with Corporal Wolford (**Attachment F**). Corporal Wolford stated that when he approached the driver and asked for his driver's license, he saw the handle of a handgun sticking out from the center console. The Driver, Devon Leach, asked if he should move it. **Corporal Wolford stated he was immediately placed into fear of a deadly force situation because of the close proximity of the handgun to the driver's hand.** Corporal Wolford stated, "if you touch it, I will smoke your ass." Corporal Wolford said he wanted to use the most concise language to convey to the driver to not touch the weapon and that he was prepared to defend himself. Corporal Wolford then instructed the driver to place his hands on the steering wheel, and he complied. Corporal Wolford then continued the traffic stop and issued a citation. Corporal Wolford stated that this was a stressful encounter for him.

Sgt. Gladney wrote that he reviewed the videos and at no other point in the recording of the traffic stop did Corporal Wolford use harsh statements or improper comments. Sgt. Gladney explained that Corporal Wolford used a trained technique referred to as "Verbal Judo" to gain immediate compliance and prevent a higher level of force. Sgt. Gladney classified this complaint as **Exonerated**. However, Sgt. Gladney then wrote, "**Training will be conducted with Officer Wolford regarding the particular choice of wording he used and how, in future situations, he can choose better verbiage**". (**Attachment G**).



The OCPO reviewed this Division Referral and found the Exonerated finding contradictory to the need for officer training. The OCPO recommended to Internal Affairs that this contradiction be resolved.

The Division Referral was sent to Lt. Aarin Harrell for review. Lt. Harrell wrote, "Officer Wolford's actions were fully within the guidelines of the city of Dallas Code of Conduct, Chapter IV, Section 4.14 (Aka Verbal Judo). Given the circumstances of his encounter with Mr. Leach, his response was necessary, appropriate, and in line with law enforcement standards for officer safety and situational control."

Lt. Harrell further wrote, "In law enforcement, officers must communicate in a manner that ensures compliance and maintains control, particularly when faced with potential threats. His verbal commands were not inappropriate but rather necessary to prevent escalation and reinforce officer safety. Given the nature of the encounter, his approach aligned with standard police protocol and de-escalation principles while maintaining a firm command presence."

The Division Referral was updated to include Lt. Harrell's review, and the section stating Corporal Wolford needed training was removed. The finding of Exonerated did not change (**Attachment H**).

Investigation

Devon Leach was cited for speeding (89 MPH in a 65 MPH zone) at this traffic stop. He also received two citations for having obstructed or unclean license plates (**Attachment I**).

The incident detail report, which details the information from the traffic stop and communication with dispatch, does not contain any information that would indicate this was potentially a deadly force situation (**Attachment J**).

On May 5, 2025, OCPO Investigator Huff attended an 8-hour de-escalation training at the academy. This was a regular academy class filled with recruits that the OCPO was allowed to join. The class did not contain any training on using profanity as part of de-escalation. Investigator Huff asked the instructor about using profanity for de-escalation, and he was advised that it is not trained. However, it is acceptable to use profanity during an escalating situation to convey the seriousness of the command. Investigator Huff asked if this class was considered a "Verbal Judo" class? The instructor advised that "Verbal Judo" is a trademarked name that the academy does not have permission to use. This class and the CIT class contain many elements of what would be in a "Verbal Judo" class.

Investigator Huff attempted to interview complainant Devon Leach but did not receive a response from him.

VI. Findings

The OCPO reached its conclusions after a thorough review of all available evidence, including video footage, factual records, statements from the involved parties, and official reports. In making its decision, the OCPO carefully considered the precise language of all



relevant policies and laws to ensure a well-reasoned and informed outcome. In the Division Referral, Lt. Harwell suggested Corporal Wolford's language was excused under the Code of Conduct section 4.14, which states, "No employee shall use loud or harsh language in performance of official duties except as necessary to gain control of an escalating situation."

This policy does not apply in this situation for the following reasons:

- The definition of "Escalating Behavior" as taught in the DPD Academy.
 - Escalating behavior is when someone becomes increasingly agitated, angry, or violent over time.
- The driver was compliant throughout the interaction.
 - The driver stopped his movement and inquired about what to do with the gun.
 - The driver complied with the officer's directions and even replied, "yes, sir" to the officer.
- During the complaint investigation, the officer gave a statement stating he was in fear of a deadly force situation; however, his actions did not support this assertion.
 - The officer did not request a cover officer.
 - The officer did not inform dispatch of the deadly force situation.
 - The officer did not draw his weapon.
 - The officer stepped in front of the driver's vehicle to continue his traffic enforcement investigation, which put him at a tactical disadvantage.
 - Each time the officer returned to his patrol vehicle, he had his back to the driver, which again was a tactical disadvantage.
- Sgt. Gladney's initial investigation resulted in a recommendation for training.
 - Even though he stated the finding was exonerated, the Sgt. was recommending training for the language the officer chose to use.
- Lt. Harwell documented in his report, "In law enforcement, officers must communicate in a manner that ensures compliance and maintains control, particularly when faced with potential threats..."
 - The phrase "I'm gonna smoke your ass" is a slang phrase. It is a figurative expression and not a literal threat. Using a figurative expression is dependent on the recipient being aware of the intended meaning.
 - Using a figurative expression does not align with what Lt. Harwell recommended for officers' communications.
- Lt. Harwell further stated, "His verbal commands were not inappropriate but rather necessary to prevent escalation and reinforce officer safety. Given the nature of the encounter, his approach aligned with standard police protocol and de-escalation principles while maintaining a firm command presence".
 - Using a slang phrase with profanity is never considered "necessary" communication.
 - Using this type of language promotes unprofessionalism.
 - Unprofessionalism promotes an image of a lack of control over the situation.
 - Maintaining a professional image and response is the cornerstone of command presence and de-escalation.
- Lt. Harwell advised that Corporal Wolford's actions were fully compliant with section 4.14 of the Code of Conduct – No employee shall use loud or harsh



language in performance of official duties except as necessary to gain control of an escalating situation.

- This traffic stop was not an escalating situation.
- Loud or harsh language does not include profanity.
- Based on the above, section 4.14 of the Code of Conduct does not apply.

Dallas Police Department Code of Conduct, Section 4.15 (Attachment K)

No employee shall use indecent or profane language in the performance of official duties or in the presence of the public.

Finding

- **Officer:** Senior Corporal Matthew Wolford (#11295)
- **Violation:** Profane or Indecent Language Prohibited (COC 4.15)
- **Disposition:** **Sustained**

VII. Recommendation(s) for Policy and/or Discipline (if any)

The OCPO recommends the need for training for Senior Corporal Wolford be reinstated into the Division Referral and the finding changed to SUSTAINED. The OCPO encourages the department to review language use protocols to reinforce professionalism during citizen interactions.

VIII. Conclusion

While OCPO acknowledges the inherent risks involved in encounters involving firearms, the circumstances of this traffic stop did not constitute an escalating or threatening situation. Therefore, the use of profane language was **not justified** under COC Section 4.14 and constitutes a **sustained** violation of **COC Section 4.15**.

Officer Lopez #12178 wrote a crime report on 12/3/2023 (215189-2023) for an Accident Involving Damage to Vehicle – TRC 550.022(c)(2). This report describes the hit-and-run collision and lists Garrett as the victim. The report has a suspect vehicle listed, including a license plate, but does not include a named suspect.

Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review:

The Internal Affairs Division conducted a preliminary review and sent a letter to Melissa Garrett on May 19, 2025. The letter stated in part:

After reviewing the information in your complaint, we have determined that the Tactical Operations Division—Vehicle Crimes Unit can handle it more appropriately. Your complaint has been forwarded to Major Eric Roman, Tactical Operations Division.

The Internal Affairs Division reached out to Traffic and learned that the case is currently suspended. Detective notes were supplied, which indicated that the detective supplied the suspect's policy number to the insurance adjuster.

OCPO Preliminary Review:

On June 14, 2025, Melissa Garrett submitted a request for an independent review of her complaint. The Office of Community Police Oversight conducted a preliminary review and found no violations of departmental policies or procedures.

Chavez wrote that the officer should be “more calmed down” and respect people in a good formal way. Chavez also complained about receiving the citation for expired registration and believes it could have been a verbal warning.

18:13:35 Officer Camacho makes contact with driver Chavez.

18:14:26 Officer Camacho returns to his vehicle to write the citation.

18:22:11 Officer Camacho returns Chavez’s driver’s license to him and hands him the citation.

18:23:58 Officer Camacho concludes the traffic stop.

Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review:

The Internal Affairs Division conducted a preliminary review and sent a letter to Rigobert Chavez on June 10, 2025. The letter stated in part:

Per our policy, the Internal Affairs Division does not investigate complaints related to the proposed guilt or innocence of a case, including disputes regarding an arrest or citation. Such matters should be addressed through the judicial system.

OCPO Preliminary Review:

On June 18, 2025, Rigobert Chavez submitted a request for an independent review of his complaint. The Office of Community Police Oversight conducted a preliminary review and found no violations of departmental policies or procedures. The traffic stop could be described as uneventful. The OCPO did not see any behavior by the officer or by the driver that could be considered discourteous or unusual.

While working on this detail, Officer Beste #11891 observed a struggle between Jrmar Jefferson and a member of Congresswoman Crockett's Dignitary Protection. Officer Beste assisted the security detail in physically removing Jrmar Jefferson from the Hall of State.

Officer Beste then observed the security detail struggling with Lamar Jefferson inside the building. Officer Beste attempted to assist the security details; however, he was disengaged, and the security detail was able to remove Lamar from the building. Officers learned from Jrmar and Lamar that they were there to serve Congresswoman Crockett in a federal order due to election fraud.

Lamar was transported to the hospital, and officers responded to the hospital to follow up on the brother's request for an assault report. Both Jrmar and Lamar complained of being choked by the security details and then dragged out of the building. Assault Detective Ebers responded to the hospital to speak with Jrmar and Lamar.

Dallas Police determined that the video of this incident did not match up with the allegations made by Jrmar and Lamar. Officer Hamlin wrote that there were no direct signs of an assault or excessive force.

Body Worn Camera Video Review:

Officer A. Beste #11891

- 17:43:08** Shows Jrmar and Lamar Jefferson being forcefully escorted out of the building by Dignitary Protection. Jrmar leaves the building on his feet.
- 17:43:24** Lamar is seen laying on the ground. Officer Beste grabs one arm, and the security detail grabs the other arm, and they help Lamar to his feet. However, Lamar does not stay on his feet, and he goes back to the ground. Dignitary Protection directs Lamar to leave the building, but he does not.
- 17:44:21** Dignitary Protection picks up Lamar by the arms and legs and carries him out of the building.

Officer E. Ortegon #12197

- 17:43:21** Jrmar Jefferson is forcibly escorted out of the building by Dignitary Protection.
- 17:44:24** Lamar Jefferson is carried out of the building by Dignitary Protection.

Video Recorded by Jrmar Jefferson:

Jrmar Jefferson submitted a 1:38 video of the incident. This video starts after Jrmar has already been removed from the building. The video shows the security detail carrying

Lamar Jefferson out of the building. They take Lamar face up while each holds an arm and a leg. Lamar is then placed on the ground outside the building.

Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review:

The Internal Affairs Division conducted a preliminary review and sent a letter to Jrmar Jefferson on May 5, 2025. The letter stated in part:

After reviewing the information provided in your complaint, it was determined that there was no violation of departmental policies or procedures.

OCPO Preliminary Review:

On June 20, 2025, Jrmar Jefferson submitted a request for an independent review of his complaint. Jrmar also submitted a video and a letter of explanation with his request. The Office of Community Police Oversight conducted a preliminary review and did not find any violations of departmental policies or procedures.

Simmons complained that he was arrested for walking on the Bank of America property, but he was actually on the easement. He also complained that Lt. Wing whispered in his ear, "I'm gonna fuck your life up and take away your concealed handgun license away from you". After the arrest, Simmons was placed in the back of a police vehicle for 30 or 40 minutes, and he started to have a seizure.

Police Report:

A review of police report 064882-2025 showed that Bank of America called the police on Raymond Simmons, who had been given a criminal trespass warning on May 5, 2025. Simmons walked on Bank of America's private property and was arrested. A loaded, Century Arms RAS47 rifle (7.62mm caliber) was confiscated from Simmons, along with a Para Ordnance P13-45 (.45 caliber) handgun.

Body Worn Camera:

A review of the Body Worn Camera shows Raymond Simmons in front of the Bank of America with a semi-automatic rifle on a sling and carrying a sign that states, “All cops suck my dick”.

Officer Smith

- 11:46:55 Officers arrest Raymond Simmons.
- 11:49:47 Officer Smith asks Simmons if he wants to get in the shade, and he replies to.
- 12:06:01 Lt. Wing explains to Simmons that he will be charged with criminal trespassing and that his license to carry is suspended.
- 12:07:54 Officer Smith places Simmons in the back of a patrol car.

Due to Simmons’ disclosure of medical issues, the decision was made to have medical personnel respond to the scene. Dallas Fire Rescue arrived on the scene at 12:20 pm. Simmons was transported to the hospital by ambulance.

Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review:

The Internal Affairs Division conducted a preliminary review and sent a letter to Raymond Simmons on June 12, 2025. The letter stated in part:

Per our policy, the Internal Affairs Division does not investigate complaints related to the proposed guilt or innocence of a case, including disputes regarding an arrest or citation.

OCPO Preliminary Review:

On June 25, 2025, Raymond Simmons submitted a request for an independent review of his complaint. The Office of Community Police Oversight conducted a preliminary review and did not find any violations of departmental policies or procedures.

Body Worn Camera:

A review of the body worn camera shows Raymond Simmons in front of the Bank of America with a semi-automatic rifle on a sling and carrying a sign that states, “All cops suck my dick”.

Officer Sidibay

12:48:06 Officer Sidibay tells Simmons that he is not going to go there (referring to private property of BofA), and if he does, he will have to disarm him and trespass him.

13:09:46 A representative from Bank of America informs Simmons that he is not allowed to step on their private property, which includes the parking lots.

13:09:54 Sgt. Savior advises Simmons that he needs to remove his vehicle from the bank’s parking lot.

13:10:44 Simmons tells the officers on scene that they are not going to arrest him. That he won’t allow it. He continues to state that he won’t allow them to arrest him. He continues to speak and says, “We all got to die someday”.

Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review:

The Internal Affairs Division conducted a preliminary review and sent a letter to Raymond Simmons on June 12, 2025. The letter stated in part:

It was determined that there was no violation of departmental policies or procedures. Based on the review, we have determined no investigation is warranted.

OCPO Preliminary Review:

Complaint

On May 3, 2025, Niriah Williams filed a complaint with the Dallas Police Department. Williams reported that Detective Hatch was involved in coercion, false reporting, obstruction of justice, and gross negligence.

Williams explained that during an incident in 2020, she was a victim of an attempted murder; however, the case was categorized as an aggravated assault with serious bodily injury. Evidence related to this case was seized, but she never received it back. Additionally, the police report inaccurately stated that Williams admitted to prostitution and claimed she did not provide any information about the shooter.

During a second incident in 2022, Williams was arrested, and Detective Hatch violated her rights by coercing a statement from her; she was not advised of her rights.

Police Report 206792-2020

This police report details an assault resulting in serious bodily injury that took place on November 18, 2020. The report lists Williams as the victim, while the suspect remains unknown. Several items that may have belonged to Williams have been tagged as evidence. These items include a blue neck pillow, a black jacket, a cell phone, a Louis Vuitton bag, a green right Adidas shoes, and \$160 in cash.

Police Report 227054-2022

This police report was for Manifesting for Prostitution, which occurred on 12/20/2022. Williams is listed as the suspect in this case. This report does not indicate that a statement was taken from Williams.

Internal Affairs Division Preliminary Review

The Internal Affairs Division conducted a preliminary review and sent a letter to Niriah Williams on July 7, 2025. The letter stated in part:

Per our policy, the Internal Affairs Division does not investigate complaints related to the proposed guilt or innocence of a case, including disputes regarding an arrest or citation.

OCPO Preliminary Review

On July 18, 2025, Niriah Williams submitted a request for an independent review of his complaint. The Office of Community Police Oversight conducted a preliminary review and found that this complaint was filed 60 days after the incident. The Dallas Police Department policy states that complaints will not be investigated for allegations that were not submitted for review within sixty (60) days of their occurrence unless they contain a criminal violation or demonstrate good cause for the delay.

SUBJECT **Complaints Received from June 1, 2025, to June 30, 2025**

This memorandum provides a summary of complaints received and resolved by OCPO in June 2025. From **June 1 to June 30, 2025**, the **Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO)** received a total of **90 complaints**. Each complaint undergoes an initial review by OCPO, in collaboration with the **Dallas Police Department's Internal Affairs Division (IAD)**, to determine the appropriate type of investigation:

Investigation Types

- **Control Number (CN):**
For allegations that could result in a written reprimand or higher. Investigated by the Internal Affairs Division.
- **Division Referral (DR):**
For less severe allegations that may result in corrective actions such as Advice and Instruction, Documented Counseling, or a Supervisor's Report of Correction. Investigated by the officer's division.
- **No Investigation (NI):**
For cases that will not be investigated by IAD (e.g., allegations submitted after 60 days or failing to meet legal requirements).
- **Public Integrity (PI):**
For allegations of criminal conduct by police officers. These are investigated by the **Public Integrity Unit**. All complaints that may rise to the level of a criminal offense, including anonymous submissions, are forwarded to this unit.
- **Administrative Inquiry Investigation:**
Investigations into misconduct or improper police handling may be needed even without formal complaints. This includes cases involving unidentified employees, vague allegations, City Manager referrals, third-party claims, anonymous criminal activity reports, directives from leadership, and instances where the complainant may be untruthful.

Reasons for No Investigation (NI)

- **Does Not Meet Criteria:** Complainant refused to provide a written statement (per TX GC 614.022)

- **Duplicate Complaint:** Allegation already under review or previously addressed.
- **Failure to Articulate:** No clear allegation of misconduct provided.
- **Guilt or Innocence:** Complaint challenges legal guilt, not officer conduct
- **Information Only:** Request for or provision of unrelated information
- **More Information Needed:** Insufficient information to proceed.
- **No Violation:** Preliminary review finds no policy violation.
- **No Violation (BWC):** Body Worn Camera review confirms no misconduct.
- **Non-Employee:** Complaint involves a non-DPD individual.
- **Sixty Day:** Complaint received more than 60 days after the incident with no good cause.
- **Third Party:** Complainant was not a victim or witness of the incident.

Complaint Classification Summary

The **90** complaints received were categorized as follows:






Person Category Arrest









SUBJECT **Complaints Received from July 1, 2025, to July 31, 2025**

This memorandum provides a summary of complaints received and resolved by OCPO in July 2025. From **July 1 to July 31, 2025**, the **Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO)** received a total of **96 complaints**. Each complaint undergoes an initial review by OCPO, in collaboration with the **Dallas Police Department's Internal Affairs Division (IAD)**, to determine the appropriate type of investigation:

Investigation Types

- **Control Number (CN):**
For allegations that could result in a written reprimand or higher. Investigated by the Internal Affairs Division.
- **Division Referral (DR):**
For less severe allegations that may result in corrective actions such as Advice and Instruction, Documented Counseling, or a Supervisor's Report of Correction. Investigated by the officer's division.
- **No Investigation (NI):**
For cases that will not be investigated by IAD (e.g., allegations submitted after 60 days or failing to meet legal requirements).
- **Public Integrity (PI):**
For allegations of criminal conduct by police officers. These are investigated by the **Public Integrity Unit**. All complaints that may rise to the level of a criminal offense, including anonymous submissions, are forwarded to this unit.
- **Administrative Inquiry Investigation:**
Investigations into misconduct or improper police handling may be needed even without formal complaints. This includes cases involving unidentified employees, vague allegations, City Manager referrals, third-party claims, anonymous criminal activity reports, directives from leadership, and instances where the complainant may be untruthful.

Reasons for No Investigation (NI)

- **Does Not Meet Criteria:** Complainant refused to provide a written statement (per TX GC 614.022)

- **Duplicate Complaint:** Allegation already under review or previously addressed.
- **Failure to Articulate:** No clear allegation of misconduct provided.
- **Guilt or Innocence:** Complaint challenges legal guilt, not officer conduct
- **Information Only:** Request for or provision of unrelated information
- **More Information Needed:** Insufficient information to proceed.
- **No Violation:** Preliminary review finds no policy violation.
- **No Violation (BWC):** Body Worn Camera review confirms no misconduct.
- **Non-Employee:** Complaint involves a non-DPD individual.
- **Sixty Day:** Complaint received more than 60 days after the incident with no good cause.
- **Third Party:** Complainant was not a victim or witness of the incident.

Complaint Classification Summary

The **96** complaints received were categorized as follows:

- **0** classified as *No Investigation (NI)*
- **0** classified as *Division Referral (DR)*
- **0** classified as *Control Number (CN)*
- **0** classified as *Public Integrity (PI)*
- **96** complaints are *pending determination*

Non-Pending Complaints

The remaining complaints (those already reviewed) were further categorized:

No complaints have been reviewed by IAD for the month of July as of this date.

Completed Cases

During the month of July 2025, there were **23** cases in which an investigation was completed.

Breakdown of Completed Cases:

- **15** cases classified as *Division Referral (DR)*
- **7** cases classified as *Control Number (CN)*
- **1** cases classified as *Outside Investigation (OI)*

Completed Cases Findings

- **4** case was listed as *Exonerated*
- **8** cases were listed as *Unfounded*

- 3 case was listed as *Not Sustained*
- 7 cases were listed as *Sustained*
- 1 case was listed as *Complete*

Most Common Allegations:

- **Unnecessary Use of Force:** 9 occurrences
- **Improper or No Action:** 7 occurrences
- **Discourtesy/Unprofessionalism:** 5 occurrences
- **Improper or No Investigation:** 4 occurrences

State Updates

On Monday, July 21st, 2025, Governor Greg Abbott announced the 1st Special Session of the 89th Texas Legislature. Members of the Legislature will have **30 days** to address the **18 priorities** set by Governor Abbott's agenda.

The special session differs from a regular legislative session in both purpose and pace. In a regular session, lawmakers have the authority to introduce and debate a wide range of legislation. In the special session, Governor Abbott exclusively sets the agenda, which is more narrowly focused and moves quickly. The Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) will provide updates on legislation that will impact police oversight in the City of Dallas as those bills progress. The following are a few highlighted bills for your reference:

Officer Personnel File Related Bills

SB14(King): Relating to certain files maintained by a law enforcement agency regarding certain employees of the agency.

HB14(Hefner): Relating to certain files maintained by a law enforcement agency regarding certain employees of the agency

SUBJECT **Briefing of Senate Bill 14**

This memorandum provides an overview of Senate Bill 14 (SB 14), which aims to establish clear guidelines regarding the maintenance, accessibility, and confidentiality of departmental files containing information related to law enforcement license holders.

Definitions:

License Holder: Individuals who hold a law enforcement officer license issued by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE). These are certified law enforcement officers, including police officers, sheriff's deputies, and other peace officers, who are required to maintain a valid license to serve in their roles.

Provisions

- **Definition of Department File:** SB 14 defines a "department file" as a record maintained by a law enforcement agency for each license holder it employs.
- **File Maintenance:** The head of the law enforcement agency, or a designee, must maintain a department file separate from personnel files maintained under existing policies in Texas Occupations Code Section 1701.4535.
- **Contents of the File:** The department file includes letters, memorandum, or documents relating to the license holder that are not included in a personnel file, such as records of alleged misconduct where insufficient evidence exists to sustain a charge of misconduct.
- **Access to Department Files:**
 - **Hiring Agencies:** May access department files under Section 1701.451 Occupation Code to evaluate candidates.
 - **TCOLE Access:** Permitted during investigations or under agency policy pursuant to Section 1701.4522(b)(1)(D).
 - **Criminal and Legal Exceptions:** Files are subject to disclosure under:
 - **Article 39.14 of the Code of Criminal Procedure** (Discovery in criminal cases)
 - **Section 511.021 of the Government Code** (Independent Investigation of Death Occurring in County Jail).
 - **Meet and Confer Agreements:** Disclosure may occur under preexisting agreements executed before September 1, 2025
- **Confidentiality and Restrictions on Disclosure:** Information in a department file is confidential and is **not** subject to public disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act (Chapter 552, Government Code).

Impacts

If enacted, SB 14 would restrict the scope of access to officer-related records by requiring police departments with a civil service rule structure similar to the Dallas Police Department to establish a separate, confidential “department file” for each licensed officer. Access to these files will be limited to hiring agencies, TCOLE during investigations, and under certain legal provisions. Specifically, SB 14 would prohibit certain access to records of unsubstantiated misconduct allegations that may hold relevance in identifying patterns of behavior.

This presents a structural barrier to the Community Police Oversight Board's fulfilling its oversight mandate. The Board's ability to review and reassess prior complaints, particularly those previously deemed unsustained, may be prohibited, even in cases where new evidence emerges or a sustained finding is later warranted. This undermines the board's core mission of ensuring fair acceptance and processing of external administrative complaints through independent review.

The **Office of Community Police Oversight** (OCPO) was established on April 24, 2019, by the Dallas City Council through Ordinance No. 31192, as part of Article XXII, Chapter 2 of the Dallas City Code. The primary purpose of the OCPO is to provide support and technical assistance to the **Community Police Oversight Board** (CPOB), formerly known as the Civilian Review Board. The OCPO helps the CPOB ensure that complaints against officers of the **Dallas Police Department** (DPD) are investigated thoroughly and transparently. Additionally, the OCPO reviews and independently investigates misconduct allegations to foster trust between the community, the City of Dallas, and the DPD.

Our Mission

Complaints & Commendations Updates

Special Investigator | Greg Huff

At the OCPO, we are committed to transparency, accountability, and continuous improvement in the Dallas Police Department (DPD). Community feedback—whether commendations or complaints—is essential to achieving these goals.

The OCPO and DPD's Internal Affairs Division received **76** new commendations from January through May 2025. These commendations praised DPD officers for:

- Outstanding job performance
- Professionalism and dedication
- Quick response times
- Acts of kindness

We thank the community for highlighting these moments of excellence.

Complaint Results / Dispositions

When an external complaint is received, the staff at the IAD documents the complaint and assigns it an External Complaint (EC) number. The OCPO and DPD's Internal Affairs Division received **588** new external complaints from January through May 2025. The IAD staff also assists in gathering research-related documentation, such as 911 call records and video footage, and distributes the complaints to lieutenants for a preliminary review. All complaints are reviewed jointly by the OCPO and DPD's Internal Affairs Division (IAD), and categorized as:

- **Control Number (CN):** Investigated by IAD – for serious allegations
- **Division Referral (DR):** Handled within the officer's division – for minor infractions
- **No Investigation (NI):** Not pursued (e.g., reported after 60 days)
- **Public Integrity (PI):** Investigated by Public Integrity Unit – for possible criminal conduct

After reviewing the feedback, the IAD Commander makes the final decision regarding the course of action for the complaint. Of the **881** new external complaints, there were **35** Control Numbers, **82** Division Referrals, and **764** No Investigations. During this period, there were **84** cases in which an investigation was completed. Of **881** new external complaints, **6** were referred to the Public Integrity Unit for investigation. Among the 84 completed investigations, **60** cases were classified as Division Referrals, **2** cases were classified as Administrative Inquiry, and **22** cases were classified as Control Number investigations

Based on a preponderance of evidence, the following are the possible results of an investigation / division referral:

- **Unfounded:** Alleged acts did not occur
- **Exonerated:** Acts occurred but were lawful and proper.
- **Not Sustained:** Insufficient evidence
- **Sustained:** Allegation supported by evidence
- **Complete:** No violation occurred (used for specific inquiries, such as firearm discharges)

Among the **84** completed investigations and division referrals, **9** cases were listed as "complete," **26** cases were listed as "exonerated," **30** cases were listed as "unfounded," **8** cases were listed as "not sustained," and **27** cases were listed as "sustained." The action taken against the Dallas police officers on **27** sustained cases resulted in the following corrective action: **2** suspensions, **5** Advice & Counseling, **7** verbal coaching, **12** documented counseling **1** allegation rescinded.




Figure 1. Each complaint undergoes an initial review by the OCPO, in collaboration with the Dallas Police Department's Internal Affairs Division (IAD), to determine the appropriate investigation type and the related allegations or policies that were violated in connection with the complaint.

Independent Investigations

From January to May 2025, the board received and evaluated **thirteen** independent review requests, prompted by community complaints or initiated by the Director of OCPO. The board decisively approved **four** of these requests, leading to the successful completion of **four** independent investigations by OCPO.

Monitoring Critical Incidents

Director & Police Monitor | Michele Andre

OCPO is notified of all **critical incidents**, such as officer-involved shootings or serious use-of-force events. These cases are closely monitored to ensure investigations are comprehensive, objective, impartial, and consistent with appropriate investigative protocols. Since January 2025, OCPO has monitored:

- **Jan 7: Officer-Involved Shooting – 11000 Block of Joaquin Drive**
- **Jan 16: Officer-Involved Shooting – I-35E Southbound at Red Oak Rd**
- **April 29: Death in Custody – 725 N. Jim Miller Rd**

Due to confidentiality, updates on ongoing investigations are not provided to the Board or the public.



Policy Recommendations

As part of our ongoing commitment to accountability and transparency, the OCPO remains focused on advancing meaningful reforms within the DPD. Recent policy initiatives include:

- Launch of the inaugural Mediation Program to enhance non-adversarial complaint resolution
- Engagement in Legislative Initiatives during the 89th Texas Legislative Session
- Reiterated the release of the Know Your Rights: Immigrant Rights informational flyer

These efforts reflect OCPO's dedication to strengthening community trust and improving departmental practices.

Inaugural Mediation Program

The OCPO, in collaboration with the IAD, is introducing the City of Dallas's inaugural Mediation Program, a voluntary, non-adversarial alternative to traditional complaint investigations. Authorized under Dallas City Code Article III, Chapter 37 § 37-32.2 ("[Ord. 31192](#)"), the program offers a confidential and respectful forum where community members and police officers can directly address concerns through constructive dialogue and mutual understanding.

Mediation Program  

Overview

The City of Dallas is committed to enhancing public trust and transparency between the community and the Dallas Police Department (DPD). In collaboration with the Internal Affairs Division (IAD), the Office of Community Police Oversight (OCPO) offers a Mediation Program as an alternative to traditional investigative procedures for resolving minor misconduct complaints. Authorized under Dallas City Code Article III, Chapter 37 § 37-32.2 ("Ord. 31152"), this program provides a collaborative, respectful setting for community members and police officers to address concerns directly.

What is Mediation?

Mediation is a voluntary, confidential process in which the complainant and the involved DPD officer engage in a structured conversation, facilitated by a trained neutral third-party mediator. The mediator ensures both individuals are heard, respected, and guided through a productive dialogue that seeks common understanding rather than assigning blame.

Mediation is Confidential

Confidentiality is a cornerstone of the program. Conversations held during mediation cannot be used in court, and neither mediators nor staff can be subpoenaed or called as witnesses. This protection is essential to where both parties can speak freely, knowing that their privacy is respected under § 37-32.2(i).

Mediation is a Voluntary Process

Participation is entirely voluntary. The officer and the complainant must agree to mediate. Eligibility is limited to cases involving minor misconduct and where there is no criminal investigation. Once agreed, mediation is scheduled promptly—usually within 30 days—to ensure timely resolution.

Mediation Participants

The complainant and the DPD officer must participate in the mediation process in good faith. Neither the complainant nor the DPD officer is required to reach an agreement regarding the outcome of the mediation. Although the outcome of mediation does not affect any pending complaint investigations or disciplinary actions, successful mediation often helps clarify misunderstandings, improve communication, and rebuild trust.

State Updates

Bill Meng began on November 12, at the conclusion of the legislative session, lawmakers filed 11,503 bills and 3,652 bills were passed. On June 2, 2025, the 89th Texas Legislature concluded on June 2, 2025.

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS: IMMIGRATION RIGHTS IN DALLAS

The City of Dallas Office of Community Police Oversight is an all-civilian department that reviews and investigates complaints impartially. It aims to enhance transparency and build trust between the Dallas Police Department and the community. This guide is designed to provide a clear understanding of your rights and essential steps to protect yourself when encountering immigration enforcement.

What happens if an immigration law enforcement officer stops you?

- You have the right to remain silent. You do not have to answer questions about your immigration status or place of birth.
- You have the right not to give consent to a search, if an officer asks to search you or your belongings, you can say no unless they have probable cause.
- You have the right to leave. If you are not being detained or under arrest, you may ask if you are free to go and leave calmly.

What happens if law enforcement officers stop you in your car?

- In Texas, you must provide your driver's license, vehicle registration, and proof of insurance upon request. Officers will consider an Enhanced Library Card for identification purposes.
- You do not have to answer questions about your immigration status.
- Officers cannot detain you solely based on your immigration status or inquire about it without reason.
- You have the right to refuse a vehicle search unless the officer presents a valid warrant or has probable cause.

What happens if Immigration Customs Enforcement (ICE) Agents come to my home?

- If ICE agents come to your door, do not open it unless they present a signed judicial warrant. Remain silent or state you want a lawyer, as anything you say can be used against you. Do not sign any documents without consulting a lawyer.

Are ICE Agents Allowed in Protected Areas?

- As of January 20, 2025, the Department of Homeland Security revised its enforcement policies regarding protected areas. ICE agents now have discretion in determining how and when to take action in locations previously considered protected.




RE: CPOB Request for Clarification on DPD Collaboration with Federal Immigration Authorities

Dear Chief Daniel Comeaux,

Thank you for responding to the Community Police Oversight Board's (CPOB) inquiry regarding the Dallas Police Department's (DPD) current and proposed collaborations with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement and other agencies within the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

We appreciate your willingness to engage on this vital issue. However, we had hoped for a more comprehensive elaboration that could provide deeper insight into your leadership philosophy and approach to a national immigration enforcement context that has raised significant concerns and fear among many Dallas residents.

As members of the CPOB appointed by the City Council and Mayor to represent and advocate for all Dallas residents, we aim to foster a transparent, respectful, and collaborative relationship with the DPD. This includes a shared understanding of departmental strategies, especially during heightened public concern.

We respectfully request a more detailed explanation of your position on DPD's collaboration with federal immigration authorities. Specifically, we want to understand how your leadership navigates the complex balance between compliance with federal mandates and responsiveness to the local community's well-being. Articulating your overarching vision and approach to leadership in these circumstances would be particularly valuable in helping the Board fulfill its mandate.

Additionally, gaining clarity on how your department ensures alignment with constitutional protections, departmental codes of conduct, and local community values in these cooperative engagements would greatly assist the Board in evaluating the impact of such partnerships on public trust and safety.

While we recognize the Department's obligation to comply with state and federal immigration laws, we urge that Dallas residents' safety, well-being, and peace of mind remain the guiding priorities in all decisions involving cooperation with external agencies. Prioritizing the needs and protections of the residents you serve is foundational to maintaining the legitimacy and integrity of local law enforcement.

With the enactment of Senate Bill 8, which expands local law enforcement's role in immigration-related matters, we understand that DPD may need to revisit and assess its current immigration policy,

especially provisions that limit inquiry into immigration status during routine policing. Should any modifications to these policies be considered, we respectfully request that the Department commit to informing the community in a clear, timely, and transparent manner. Ensuring open communication around such changes is essential to sustaining public confidence and reinforces the Department's continued dedication to equitable and constitutional policing.

We are committed to productive and constructive dialogue that upholds the integrity of law enforcement while addressing the legitimate concerns of the residents we collectively serve. Through this partnership, we hope to identify and support solutions that responsibly balance public safety with the concerns expressed by our diverse community.






