French IV (1 credit)

Students eligible for this course will be those who have successfully completed French I, II, and III. The central themes of this course are **the world of speaking French, French History, news, movies, and society**. Students will analyze culturally authentic print, digital, audio and audiovisual materials in a variety of contexts; paraphrase and analyze the main idea, theme, and supporting details from fiction and nonfiction texts and audio and audiovisual materials; infer meaning of unfamiliar words or phrases in texts, audio, and audiovisual materials; and compare and contrast cultural practices and perspectives from authentic print, digital, audio, and audiovisual materials. Students will present information orally and in writing using a mixture of sentences and connected discourse with appropriate and applicable grammar structures and processes at the specified proficiency levels and express and defend an opinion or persuade others orally and in writing with supporting elaborative statements and with recommendations; narrate situations and events orally and in writing using connected sentences and some connected discourse with details and elaboration; and inform others orally and in writing about a variety of topics using connected sentences and some connected discourse with details and elaboration.

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE LITTLE ELM INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT PROVIDING FOR THE DEFEASANCE OF CERTAIN CURRENTLY OUTSTANDING DISTRICT OBLIGATIONS; DIRECTING THAT THE BOARD SECRETARY, OR HER DESIGNEE, EFFECTUATE THE DEFEASANCE OF THESE OBLIGATIONS; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN ESCROW AGREEMENT; AND OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the *Board*) of the Little Elm Independent School District (the *District*) previously adopted orders (the *Orders*) authorizing the issuance of obligations (the *Obligations*) and as listed in Schedule I;

WHEREAS, pursuant to applicable Texas law and the Orders, the District is authorized to defease selected Obligations, (the *Defeased Obligations*) by depositing with an authorized escrow agent an amount of money that, when combined with investment earnings thereon, will be sufficient to pay, when due (whether by reason of stated maturity or prior redemption), the accrued interest of such Defeased Obligations and, at the time of such defeasance, the Defeased Obligations shall be discharged and no longer considered outstanding indebtedness of the District;

WHEREAS, the District's Authorized Officials (defined herein) will select the Defeased Obligations at a later date, but before August 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District and its residents to defease the Defeased Obligations as herein provided in order to reduce the District's aggregate debt service requirements and, with respect thereto, establish a defeasance escrow and provide for its funding; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE LITTLE ELM INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT:

SECTION 1: A portion of the Defeased Obligations, as described in Schedule II, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 (but to include such additional amounts due to availability of funds, as hereinafter described), eligible to be defeased and ultimately redeemed on their respective Redemption Date, are hereby defeased as of the date of the Defeasance Resolution (defined below). The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Superintendent and Chief Financial Officer, as well as any interims holding the aforementioned positions (the *Authorized Officials*), to ultimately determine the principal amount of Defeased Obligations to be defeased on the basis of the availability of funds for such purpose by the funding deadline hereinafter described, which final amount shall be evidenced in the hereinafter-defined Agreement. This election to redeem is irrevocable upon adoption of this resolution (the *Defeasance Resolution*) by the Board. The Notice of Defeasance for the Defeased Obligations shall be prepared and delivered in the form required under the Orders. On or before August 31, 2026, the District shall transfer its lawfully available funds to [____], as the escrow agent for the Defeased Obligations (the *Escrow Agent*), an amount sufficient (when combined with investment earnings on such initial deposit) to pay all costs of interest due and owing on the Defeased Obligations from the time of such deposit through the Redemption Date, plus the principal amount of the Defeased Obligations due and owing at such time of redemption. Upon the making of such deposit, the Defeased Obligations will be

determined to have been defeased and, as a result, discharged and no longer considered outstanding as an obligation of the District in accordance with applicable Texas law.

SECTION 2: The Escrow and Trust Agreement, dated as of [] (the *Agreement*), by and between the District and the Escrow Agent and relating to the Defeased Obligations, attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by reference as a part of this Defeasance Resolution for all purposes, is hereby approved as to form and content, and such Agreement, together with such changes or revisions as may be necessary to accomplish the defeasance of the Defeased Obligations or benefit the District, is hereby authorized to be executed by the President, Vice President, or Secretary of the Board, the Superintendent of Schools, or the Chief Financial Officer for and on behalf of the District and as the act and deed of this Board; and such Agreement as executed by said officials shall be deemed approved by the Board and constitute the Agreement herein approved.

Furthermore, the President, Vice President, or Secretary of the Board, the Superintendent of Schools, or the Chief Financial Officer, and Bond Counsel, in cooperation with the Escrow Agent are hereby authorized and directed to make the necessary arrangements for the deposit of cash and/or the purchase of any securities referenced in the Agreement and the delivery thereof to the Escrow Agent upon delivery to the Escrow Agent of the funds described in Section 1 above for deposit to the credit of the “LITTLE ELM INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT DEFEASANCE UNLIMITED TAX SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS, SERIES [] ESCROW FUND (2026)” (the *Escrow Fund*), including the execution of the subscription forms, if any, for the purchase and issuance of the Escrowed Securities (as defined in the Agreement) for deposit to the Escrow Fund; all as contemplated and provided by the provisions of applicable Texas law, the respective Orders, this Defeasance Resolution, and the Agreement.

SECTION 3: The President and Secretary of the Board are authorized and instructed to give notice of defeasance described herein to the paying agent/registrar for the Defeasance Obligations called for defeasance prior to stated maturity as provided in the respective Orders. The form of the Notice of Defeasance to accomplish the foregoing is attached as Exhibit A hereto and incorporated by reference for all purposes.

SECTION 4: The Board hereby appoints [] (the *Verification Agent*), to verify the sufficiency of the deposit to the Escrow Fund to accomplish the defeasance of the Defeased Obligations to the Maturity Date.

SECTION 5: The President and Secretary of the Board, or any of them, are authorized to evidence adoption of this Defeasance Resolution and to do any and all things necessary or convenient to effect the redemption described herein and otherwise give effect to the intent and purpose hereof.

SECTION 6: The Board hereby approves payment from lawfully available District funds of professional fees and expenses of the District’s Bond Counsel, the District’s Financial Advisor, the Escrow Agent, the Verification Agent, the paying agent/registrar for the Defeased Obligations, and any other party whose services have been determined by the District to be necessary to accomplish the purpose and intent of this Defeasance Resolution.

SECTION 7: The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Defeasance Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the Board.

SECTION 8: All orders and resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Defeasance Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Defeasance Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

SECTION 9: This Defeasance Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

SECTION 10: If any provision of this Defeasance Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Defeasance Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the Board hereby declares that this Defeasance Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

SECTION 11: It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Defeasance Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Defeasance Resolution, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, as amended, Texas Government Code.

SECTION 12: Though such parties may be identified, and the entry into a particular form of contract may be authorized herein, the Board hereby delegates to the Superintendent of Schools or the Chief Financial Officer the authority to independently select the counterparty to any agreement with the Escrow Agent, Verification Agent or any other contract that is determined by the Superintendent of Schools, the District's Chief Financial Officer, the District's Financial Advisor, or Bond Counsel to be necessary or incidental to carry out the provisions of this Defeasance Resolution, as long as each of such contracts has a value of less than the amount referenced in Section 2252.908 of the Texas Government Code (collectively, the *Ancillary Contracts*); and, as necessary, to execute the Ancillary Contracts on behalf and as the act and deed of the District. The Board has not participated in the selection of any of the business entities which are counterparties to the Ancillary Contracts.

SECTION 13: This Defeasance Resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so resolved.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees ("Board") wishes to reward Little Elm ISD employees for their continued service to the students and school community; and

WHEREAS, a public school purpose will be served by the payment of a one-time payment to District employees, in order to demonstrate support of its employees, enhance employee morale and support the retention of employees; and

WHEREAS, the District's current financial position allows for payment of a one-time payment to employees of \$500 as further detailed below (the "Payment"); and

Now therefore it be resolved by the Board that:

1. The Board authorizes the Payment to each individual who began their employment prior to July 1, 2026, as compensation for continued service to the District; and
2. The Board finds that a public purpose and a benefit to Little Elm ISD exists in the issuance of the one-time payment; and
3. The Board authorizes the Superintendent to take any action necessary to implement the intent of this resolution, including making determinations of individual employee eligibility to receive the bonus payment.

Notification of Coverage Changes and Language Refinements Effective July 1, 2026

As part of the annual coverage review, the TASB Risk Management Fund (Fund) implemented the following coverage changes and language refinements ***for all renewals taking effect on or after July 1, 2026***. This document is a summary of changes and refinements only; please carefully review the full text of all Fund Coverage Agreements and any applicable Contribution and Coverage Summary (CCS).

Automobile Liability & Physical Damage Coverage Agreement

- Under Section 3.4, revised the language regarding a non-owned automobile being maintained or operated to include the term “use.”
- Under Section 3.5, expanded the definition of Covered Person to include the scenario of members loaning vehicles to other districts. This activity is allowed under Section 4, but this update provides additional clarity.
- Under Section 4, clarified the second sentence that grants liability coverage to non-owned autos
- Described in 3.4(B), which addresses leased, rented, and borrowed vehicles and (D), which addresses automobile career and technology programs.

School Liability Coverage Agreement

- Revised the Chapter 118 endorsement to state that losses under the endorsement do not erode the aggregate limit for other types of professional legal liability claims.
- Increased Chapter 118 limits to \$1,000,000 per claim and \$2,000,000 annual aggregate, with options to purchase higher limits, up to \$5,000,000, for additional contribution.
- Under the Chapter 118 Endorsement, revised the position of words for clarity.
- Renamed the Chapter 118 Endorsement to Chapter 118: Employment Practices – Student Abuse and Reporting Endorsement.

Property Coverage Agreement

- Removed the single-ply membrane sublimit and replaced it with actual cash value (ACV) valuation for single-ply membrane roofs that are over seven years old. The ACV limitation will not apply to Very Severe Hail-rated single-ply membrane roofs.
- Reduced the deductible for motor-driven equipment from the all-other-perils (AOP) deductible to \$2,500.
- Added language to the Flood Endorsement to describe how coverage applies when covered buildings are sited in Locations with more than one flood zone.
- Removed the application of the percentage deductible to covered property under \$100,000, making this property subject to the Occurrence Minimum Deductible only.
- Under Section 7, increased the base supplemental coverage limit for Extra Expense & Loss in Revenue to \$1,000,000 from \$500,000.
- Increased the base sublimit for the Flood and Earthquake Endorsements to \$5,000,000 from \$2,000,000.
- Establish a maximum Weather Perils Deductible for freeze losses. The maximum deductible would be \$1,000,000 or less depending on member size.
- Under Section 5, add language to indicate that all limitations to damage payments apply to aesthetic impairment payments as well, and that acceptance of an aesthetic impairment payment must be no later than 90 days from the determination that the loss to covered property resulted from aesthetic impairment.

- Under Section 3.4, update the definition of occurrence to improve clarity and incorporate a recommendation from the Fund’s property reinsurance panel.
- Under Section 4, clarify that an increased degree of damage later discovered does not alter a previous election for payments for repairs or for ACV for the *same* property. Repair or ACV elections for unrelated damage, such as to a separate building, are not affected.

Property Coverage Provisions

Weather Perils: Weather Perils is an Occurrence of wind, hail, convective storm, or freeze. The Weather Perils Limit and Deductible shown on this CCS will apply to Loss (including ensuing Loss) by a Weather Peril. Weather Perils does not include Named/Numbered Windstorm.

Named/Numbered Windstorm: Named/Numbered Windstorm (NWS) is an Occurrence of hurricane, typhoon, tropical cyclone, tropical storm, or tropical depression (but not other convective storms) that is designated by name or number by the National Weather Bureau, National Hurricane Center, or any recognized meteorological authority, including any related wind-driven rain, flood, tidal water or wave, storm surge, wave wash, surface water, overflow of bodies of water, or spray from any of these conditions. The NWS Limit and Deductible indicated on this CCS will apply to Loss (including ensuing Loss) by an NWS.

However, any flood-related Loss (including ensuing Loss) during an NWS Occurrence will be considered a separate Flood Occurrence with a Flood Limit as indicated on this CCS. For all other NWS Loss (including ensuing Loss) during this combined perils event, the NWS Limit indicated on this CCS will apply. Only the higher deductible of the two perils will apply during this combined perils event.

Percent Deductible/Occurrence Minimum Deductible: General. When Covered Property sustains a Loss caused by a Weather Peril or NWS, the Fund Member's deductible will be a Percent-based Deductible or an Occurrence-based Minimum Deductible. For Covered Property of \$100,000 or over, the higher deductible applies. For Covered Property under \$100,000, the Occurrence Minimum Deductible applies only.

Deductible calculation. The Percent Deductible amount will be calculated based on the designated percent, as shown on the CCS, applied to the Total Covered Value of a Loss-affected Covered Property (including Personal Property contents) in the Statement of Values schedule, which is considered a part of this CCS. This designated percent is reflected on the schedule as the deductible dollar amount listed under a Loss-affected Covered Property's deductible column.

Covered Property that does not appear on the Statement of Values schedule and sustains a Loss will be subject to the applicable deductible based on its Total Covered Value at the time of the Loss.

Multiple-Covered Property Loss. In the case of multiple \$100,000 or over Loss-affected Covered Properties, the member will incur a Percent Deductible for each property, calculated the same as one Loss-affected Covered Property only. These Percent Deductible amounts will be added to determine the Total Percent Deductible amount for comparison with the Occurrence Minimum Deductible amount. (However, for payment purposes, the Total Percent Deductible calculation below will not affect the Percent Deductible application to each Covered Property.)

To determine whether the Total Percent Deductible amount or the Occurrence Minimum Deductible amount applies when multiple Covered Properties are Loss-affected, only the actual Loss amount within each property's Percent Deductible amount will apply toward the summed Total Percent Deductible amount, which is then compared with the Occurrence Minimum Deductible amount; the higher deductible applies.

Payment obligation. For Covered Property \$100,000 or over, if the Fund has any payment obligation above the Occurrence Minimum Deductible, this payment will be based on the Loss amount for each Covered Property exceeding that property's scheduled or determined Percent Deductible amount.

For Covered Property under \$100,000, if the Fund has any payment obligation, this payment will be based on the Loss amount exceeding the Occurrence Minimum Deductible.

Occurrence Minimum Deductible—General. Regardless of the Total Percent Deductible, the amount of Loss sustained, the number of Loss-affected Covered Properties in an Occurrence, or any other factor, in no event will the member's Percent Deductible obligation (Total or individual) be less than the Occurrence-based Minimum Deductible listed on the CCS.

Location: A Location is a single street address that is the site of the Covered Property. Locations may have multiple Covered Properties, including structures.

Flood Zone Exclusions: The Fund Member's Covered Property (as defined in the Coverage Agreement) is excluded from coverage under the Flood Endorsement of the Coverage Agreement if more than 15% of the Location subject to loss is located in any Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA) beginning with 'A' or 'V' as identified on the most recently published pre-Loss FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM).

Other Limits: If more than one Per Occurrence Limit may be applicable, the Fund will determine which limit or limits will apply.

Statement of Values: The Statement of Values schedule will be provided to the Fund Member before the beginning of the Participation Period and is considered incorporated into the Agreements between the Fund and the member. The Fund Member agrees to allow the Fund to conduct property appraisals of the Fund Member's property periodically and agrees to accept values provided by the Fund. The Fund reserves the right to adjust the Fund Member's contribution for newly-constructed Buildings or Other Structures that are Covered Property and accepted within the Participation Period based on the certificate of occupancy date. The Fund reserves the right to adjust the Fund Member's contribution for newly-acquired Buildings or Other Structures that are Covered Property and acquired within the Participation Period based on the acquisition date.

Salvage: The Fund will have the right, at its discretion, to exercise rights of salvage to any damaged property paid for or replaced under the terms of this Agreement.

Single Ply Membrane: 'Single Ply Membrane' is a synthetic roofing material that includes EPDM, TPO, and PVC membranes.

Fund Member Mitigation: As indicated in the Property Coverage Agreement, including Sections 9.29 and 12.5, the Fund Member must preserve Covered Property before and after Loss, or the Fund may exclude coverage.

Fund Member Notice: As indicated in the Property Coverage Agreement, including Section 13.1, time is of the essence for the Fund Member to give notice of a claim for all Loss. Coverage is only available if the Fund Member reports all Loss within 365 days of an Occurrence.

Limit Elimination: The Fund may reduce all Property limits to zero and cease all payments (promised or otherwise) to the member for any claim under this CCS if the Fund's applicable property reinsurance coverage exhausts during the Participation Period through any property claim payment to any Fund Member.

Statement of Values: The Fund Member has provided the Fund with the most complete and accurate listing of vehicles owned and leased by the Fund Member and will make this listing current throughout the Participation Period. The Fund Member agrees to allow the Fund to conduct vehicle appraisals of the Fund Members' fleet periodically and agrees to accept values provided by the Fund, if any.

Salvage: The Fund will have the right, at its discretion, to exercise rights of salvage to any damaged property paid for or replaced under the terms of this Agreement.

Excluded Vehicles: Vehicles specifically listed on this CCS are excluded from all Automobile coverage as noted under 'Exclusion.'

School Liability Coverage Provisions

Known Prior Wrongful Acts: As indicated in the School Liability Coverage Agreement, including Section 4.1, the Fund Member agrees that all known prior Wrongful Act (including previously reported acts) that may result in a legal claim against the Fund Member have been fully disclosed to prior carriers, including the Fund, and no coverage will apply to these acts under this CCS. However, this CCS does not void coverage afforded to the Fund Member under any previous CCS.

Fund-requested Settlement Contributions: As indicated in the School Liability Coverage Agreement, including Section 4.6, the Fund may request a monetary or non-pecuniary contribution from the Fund Member to address the portion of a Claim that is not covered by the Coverage Agreement so that the Fund can settle the Claim in its entirety. Any refusal by the Fund Member to contribute to the settlement as requested by the Fund will result in the Fund Member being responsible for further defense costs and indemnity payments other than what the Fund would have paid.

Chapter 118: Employment Practices – Student Abuse and Reporting Endorsement Coverage: As indicated in the School Liability Coverage Agreement Chapter 118: Employment Practices – Student Abuse and Reporting Endorsement, the Fund will provide limited coverage for K-12 school districts for Claims arising from allegations under Chapter 118 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. This endorsement excludes coverage under the General Liability Coverage and provides claims-made coverage under the Professional Legal Liability Coverage. The coverage for state court Chapter 118 Claims only (those Claims that are filed and adjudicated in, or remanded to, the state courts of Texas) will have Claim Expense within the CCS-indicated per Claim and annual aggregate limits of liability.

Non-Chapter 118 Professional Legal Liability Claims: The aggregate limit for non-Chapter 118 Professional Legal Liability Claims will not decrease due to any Damages or Claim Expense arising from Chapter 118 Claims.

Workers' Compensation – Aggregate Deductible Provisions

Claims Liability: The Fund Member agrees to reimburse the Fund for amounts paid for workers' compensation claims with injury dates within the Participation Period up to the Claims Liability amount (Aggregate Deductible). The Fund will pay claims in excess of the Claim Liability amount.

Benefit Limits: Workers' Compensation benefits paid to the Fund Member's employees under this CCS will be as defined in the Texas Workers' Compensation Act (the Act). The Fund is responsible for claims payments as reflected in this CCS. This CCS does not cover the defense of any suit or claim against a Fund Member except a workers' compensation claim by an eligible employee or former employee of the Fund Member for the payment of statutory workers' compensation benefits.

Cooperation: The Fund Member designates the TASB Risk Management Fund as the Workers' Compensation claim administrator of record for all purposes. The Fund Member agrees to use the Fund's contractors for services related to the administration of claims and to follow the Fund's election under Section 504.053 of the Labor Code to direct care through the Political Subdivision Workers' Compensation Alliance.

Claims Reporting: For Workers' Compensation claims arising during the Participation Period, the Fund Member agrees to report those claims timely and solely to the Fund. The report of Workers' Compensation claims to any other entity will waive all Fund liability under this agreement for those claims, regardless of reporting sequence. 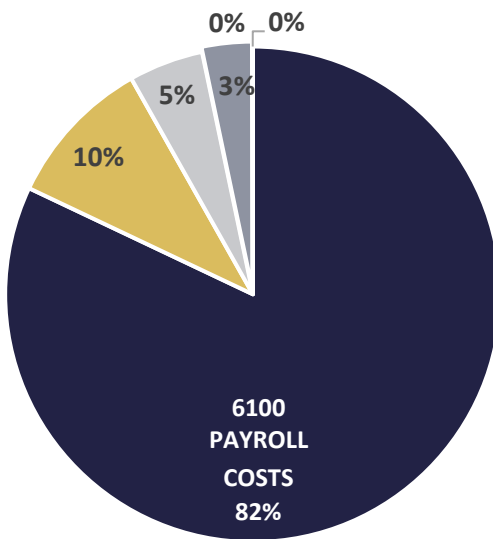

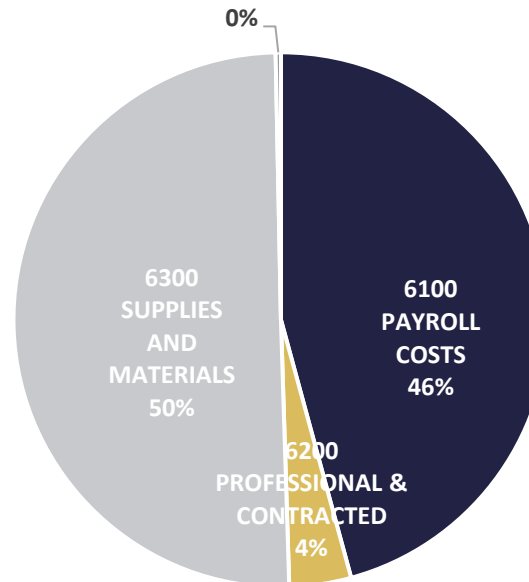

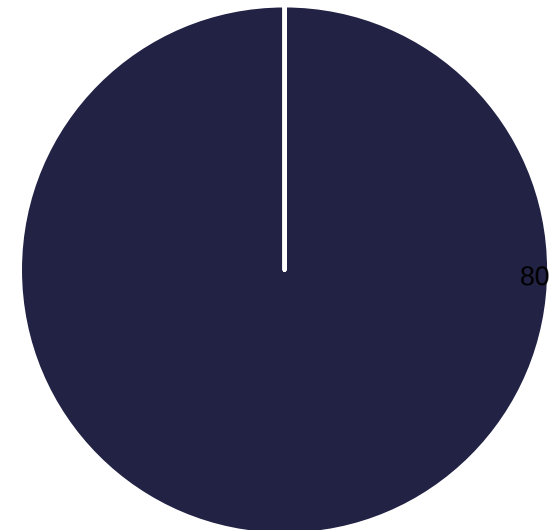

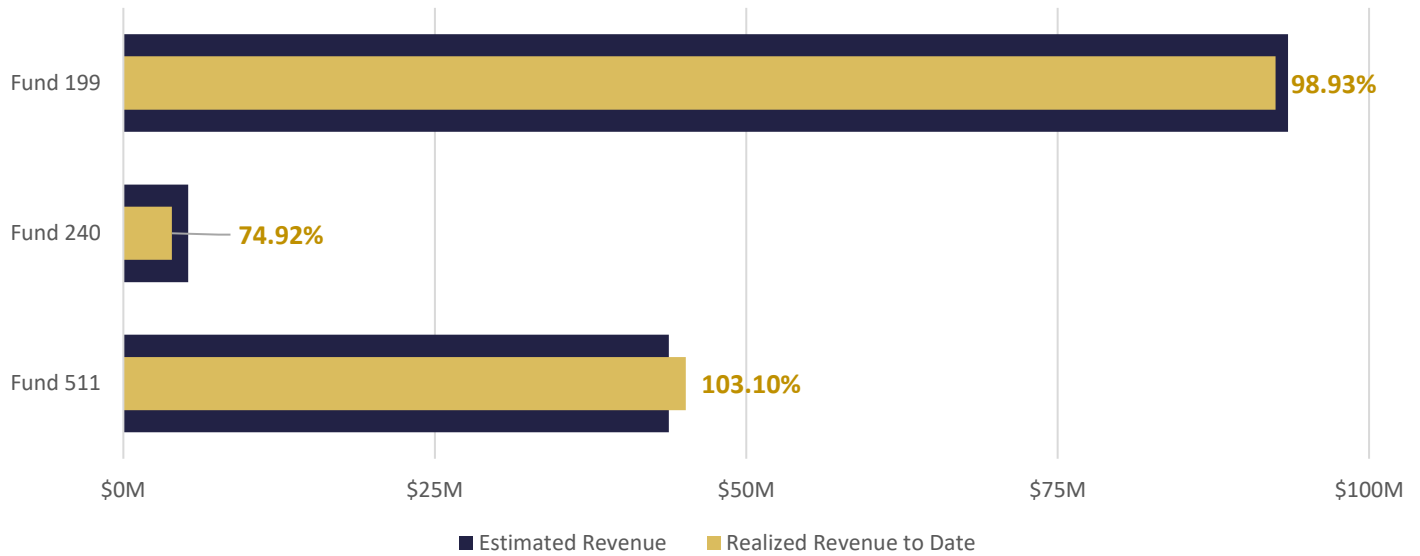

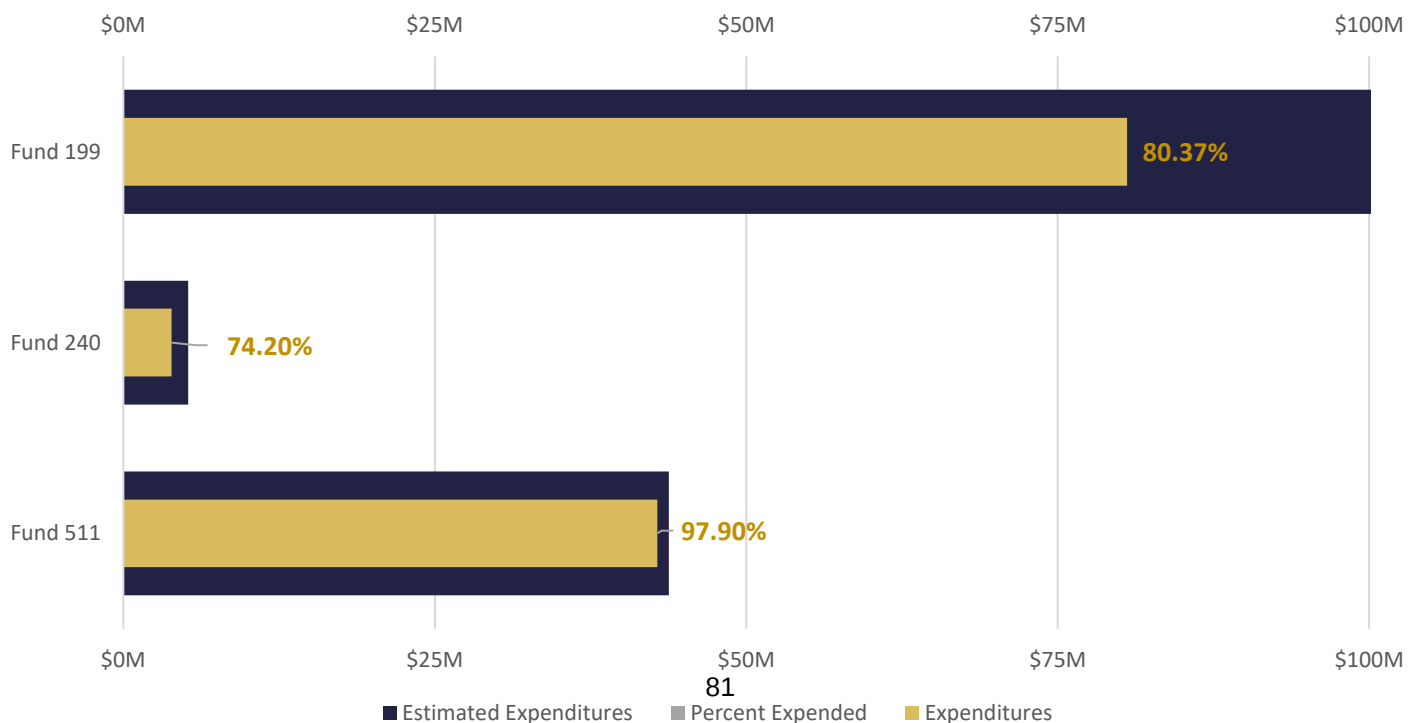

LEISD Purchasing Cooperative Memberships

House Bill 273 requires that school district disclose the amounts spent on purchasing cooperative fees on an annual basis. Specifically, it states:

Sec. 44.0331. MANAGEMENT FEES UNDER CERTAIN COOPERATIVE PURCHASING CONTRACTS. (a) A school district that enters into a purchasing contract valued at \$25,000 or more under Section 44.031(a)(5), under Subchapter F, Chapter 271, Local Government Code, or under any other cooperative purchasing program authorized for school districts by law shall document a contract-related fee, including a management fee, paid by or to the district and the purpose of each fee under the contract. (b) The amount, purpose, and disposition of any fee described by Subsection (a) must be presented in a written report and submitted annually in an open meeting of the board of trustees of the school district. The written report must appear as an agenda item.

A benefit of using these purchasing cooperatives as a resource is economy of scale through the buying power of much larger entities. Cooperatives follow bidding laws in awarding contracts to their vendors and therefore, by law, school districts are allowed to use contracts awarded by the cooperatives once interlocal purchasing agreements have been established.
